Why Now?



State Requirements: A comprehensive program of student services is required as part of the Pennsylvania School Code in Chapter 12. Additionally, a comprehensive guidance plan is required as part of the Pennsylvania School Code in Chapter 339 (all students exposed to Career and Technical Education by grade 5).

Abbreviated Timeline



- Fall of 2014: PDE issued CTE audit findings.
- **Spring of 2015:** Collaborative planning underway for developing Comprehensive Guidance Plan.
- August November 2015: Presentation to principals at Leadership
 Week regarding Guidance Plan requirements and tools for equipping and
 supporting Counselors and Social Workers; Presentation to Counselors
 and Social Workers.
- **January, 2016:** Implementation of K-12 career lessons begins (one lesson per month per grade level).
- **February, 2016:** Overview provided to the Board via Board Update.
- June, 2016: Final Career Guidance Plan presented to the Board and PDE.
- August, 2016: Full implementation targeted to begin.

Not Just a Mandate



The Guidance Plan will:

- Serve as an organizing frame for key college and career readiness efforts.
- Enable all of our students to benefit from comprehensive guidance curriculum and services, among which exposure to CTE pathways is incorporated.
- Increase the likelihood that all students graduate college and career ready, equipped to attain a postsecondary degree or workforce certification.

- All students graduate with a career plan.
