

We Promise Participation

Participation:

Program is offered to Black male students in grades 9-12.


- ➤ All 6-12, 9-12, and special schools receive support
- 9th & 10th graders must have a cumulative GPA of 1.50-2.49
- ➤ 11th & 12th graders must have a cumulative GPA of 1.75-2.49
- Currently servicing over 300 scholars in grades 10-12
