### **Backpack Giveaways**



San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools (SBCSS) partnered with various community groups to hold four backpack giveaways across the county, distributing more than 10,000 backpacks to students PK through grade 12.

The first drive-thru event took place on Thursday, July 21 at the San Bernardino County Fairgrounds in Victorville, CA.

Students and families received backpacks filled with back-to-school supplies, books

haircuts and health services.

Staff and volunteers also provided families with food boxes filled with fruit, vegetables, canned foods and pasta to ensure students have nutritious and well-balanced meals.

SBCSS, in partnership with various community organizations, continued these same efforts at three additional events located at San Bernardino Valley College, Joshua Tree Elementary School and Melva Davis Academy of Excellence.





### **Mental Health Student Leadership**

The San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools, in partnership with the Institute for Child Development and Family Relations at California State University, San Bernardino (CSUSB), provided a week-long suicide prevention training for university students.

During the week of Aug. 8, CSUSB students experienced in-depth training on suicide



prevention, leadership skills development and knowledge about mental health challenges.

"I think the biggest talking point here is to be there for somebody," said CSUSB graduate student Ulises Velasco. "If you notice somebody looking down, you can be that one person that gets them out of their bad day or bad moment or those suicidal thoughts by giving them an ear and by lending them a shoulder to cry on. Everybody is capable of being that support buddy for somebody."

Students were equipped with the fundamental knowledge and tools necessary to provide support to their peers in times of crisis. They will continue year-round learning with quarterly check-ins to provide updates, program shakeouts and booster training.



### **Veterans Diploma Project Now Accepting Applications**

Applications are now being accepted for the annual ceremony that awards diplomas to eligible individuals whose high school education was interrupted due to military service or internment in a Japanese American relocation camp.

The San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools, in partnership with the County of San Bernardino Department of Veterans Affairs, is pleased to announce the 14th annual San Bernardino County Operation Recognition Veterans Diploma Project.

This project provides an opportunity for veterans and internees that may qualify for a high school diploma to be presented with a diploma as authorized through the California Education Code.



Veterans who served in and received an honorable discharge from World War II, the Korean War or the Vietnam War, or individuals who were interned in a Japanese American relocation camp are eligible to participate.

Surviving family members of those who meet these requirements are also encouraged to apply for posthumous recognition.

The applicant must be a current San Bernardino County resident and have been enrolled in high school prior to enlistment or internment. There is no charge to participate.

To be considered for this year's recognition, applications must be submitted by Monday, October 24.

Applicants will be notified of their status by October 27

and qualified applicants will be provided with ceremony details.
