It is that time of year to honor our Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) students and celebrate their hard work and success! Congratulations to the nearly 2,500 San Bernardino County AVID seniors who will be graduating from 55 county high schools.



Annually, a scholarship reception and senior recognition event is hosted by the AVID teams of Riverside, Inyo, Mono and San Bernardino (RIMS) counties to celebrate their graduating students. This year's class will be honored during a virtual ceremony on May 10 and May 13.

Of the students graduating this year, I am pleased to share 52 were recipients of the RIMS AVID scholarship. Each of these students earned a \$1,500 scholarship to help them pursue their dreams of a higher education. Overall, more than \$125,000 in scholarships were awarded to AVID students across the four-county region.

AVID's mission is to increase the college-going rates among diverse and underrepresented demographic groups. An impressive 86 percent of AVID graduates from our county are accepted to a 4-year college.

I would like to thank the coaches, teachers and site staff who have mentored and guided these students to each new level of academic excellence.

AVID provides a rigorous platform for students to grow and be successful as they continue to transform their lives through education. Best wishes to the AVID class of 2021!
