More than 4,100 students participated in unique industry sector rooms featuring high school and post-secondary pathways. And that was just the first day. The virtual nature of the event had students exploring and navigating the STEM content at their own pace.

Regional Occupation Program (ROP) Administrator Carol Tsushima said, "#STEMapalooza21 increased access to thousands of students across the Inland Empire who otherwise would not have participated if it hadn't been a virtual event."

With the flexibility of this year's event registration continuing through March 15, we expect to serve nearly 18,000 students from 35 school districts in San Bernardino and Riverside Counties.

I sincerely appreciate all the schools and districts, as well as the partners and other organizers who teamed with our office to make this year's STEMapalooza widely available for every child who wished to participate.

We know that providing opportunities like this help give our students a taste of the careers and preparations needed for future success. Since March 2020, Webisode Wednesdays has provided a network of support to nearly 2,600 teachers, administrators, educators and parents.
