I am continuously inspired by our students' pursuit of knowledge. Even after a year of distance learning, over 80 of our elementary students logged on for eight days during their summer break to participate in a Virtual Computer Science Summer Camp hosted by our Expanded Learning program.

From June 21 to July 1, our SBCSS staff, along with educators from the University of Redlands, utilized a free curriculum created by Google to introduce young students to coding in fun and entertaining ways. Lessons were divided into focused, single day events to keep students engaged. During one of the themed sessions, participants dressed up as their own superheroes, complete with backstory and superpowers, and used a block-based coding program called Scratch to create an animated story that embodied their character.

Students also received two physical starter kits from Play Piper that demonstrated the relationship between coding and circuitry. They were able to experience the practical applications of the technology by creating video game controllers and simulated traffic lights. Students were also exposed to advanced vocabulary related to engineering, physics, and computer science. Best of all, students kept their kits and will retain access to the online courses, allowing them to continue learning about these topics throughout the summer and upcoming school year.

This summer education event was made possible through the SBCSS Expanded Learning and Digital Learning Services programs, as well as the phenomenal network of support that facilitated this innovative opportunity.

It has been proven that early exposure to computer science greatly improves the chances of students choosing to pursue higher education, especially in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) fields. We hope by encouraging students to explore these fields now we can help to prepare them for greater opportunities in the workforce of tomorrow.
