

Countywide School Closures To Extend Through Rest Of Academic Year



County Schools has made available portals on its <u>website</u> to share resources and tools for school districts, families and students, in the areas of distance learning, nutrition, and well-being.

Following the guidance of Gov. Gavin Newsom and State Superintendent Tony Thurmond, all 33 school districts in San Bernardino County announced on April 1 that they will extend the closures of school campuses through the end of this academic year for the health and well-being of students and staff.

Even with the physical closure of school sites, learning and nutrition for students will continue for the rest of the school year as districts ramp up distance learning capabilities and continue to offer nutritious meals during weekdays for students.

In March, County Schools made portals available on its website at www.sbcss.net to share resources and tools for school districts, families and students, in the areas of distance learning and school meals.
