Back-to-school has taken on a new meaning and significance amidst the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. As county superintendent, I want to welcome back students and staff to the new 2020-21 academic school year. This has certainly been both a challenging and exciting time for education, as school districts across the nation have adjusted to new virtual learning environments. Seeing districts across our region pivot to online digital platforms has been highly uplifting.

While many of our districts continue to move forward with implementing rigorous distance learning, one of our 33 school districts is moving forward with on-campus, face-to-face instruction. Lucerne Valley Unified School District's reopening waiver was approved to have in-person instruction for grades TK-6 after meeting the San Bernardino County Department of Public Health's strict guidelines. With the start of the new school year, I had the pleasure of visiting their campus to welcome back students. It was wonderful to see and hear the excitement of students returning to school with their teachers and classmates again.

For County Schools-operated programs, our Student Services and Technical Services branches have been able to collectively distribute 110 T-Mobile hot spots and 517 student devices to be used for distance learning since the start of the school year! As part of our ongoing commitment to promoting equitable outcomes in remote learning for all our students, SBCSS has partnered with Empire KVCR and

These Prom Dresses will be provided to SBCSS Desert/Mountain Operations students attending the Winter and Spring Celebrations and Dances.


SBCSS Desert/Mountain Operations is very appreciative of this generous donation. We expect these dresses will make wonderful experiences and memories for our students.
