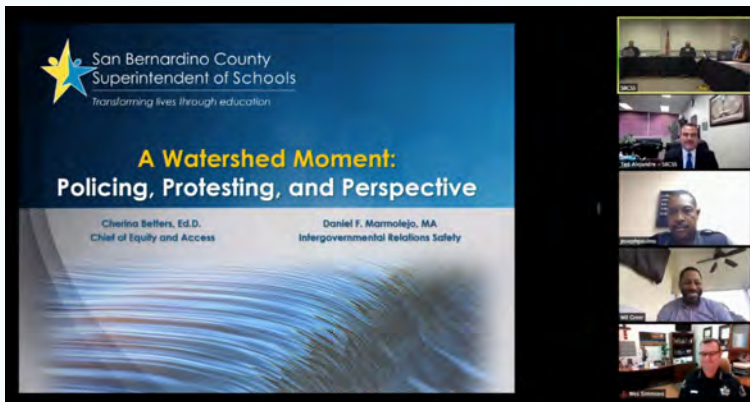




'Watershed Moment' Webinar Opens Dialogue On Policing, Protesting, Perspectives

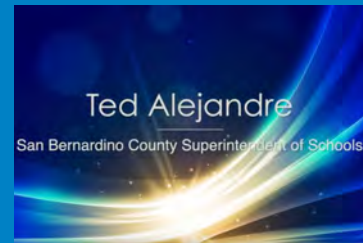

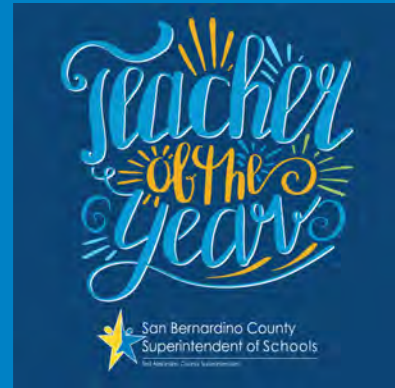
The SRSWC attracts not only educators, but also professionals in law enforcement, health and social services, government and faith-based groups. This conference truly embraces a collective impact approach.
