This year's class of Education Medal of Honor and Distinguished Service recipients were honored on April 29.


It's an honor and privilege each year to share the outstanding accomplishments of those who are recognized at the Spring Awards Banquet of the San Bernardino County School Boards Association.

### County Students Claim Golds At Statewide SkillsUSA Conference

The Ontario Convention Center served as the epicenter for the state's annual SkillsUSA Conference, which was held April 25-28. More than 3,200 students across California - including large contingents from San Bernardino County high schools - attended this year's statewide conference, which focuses on preparing students to be world-class workers and leaders.

With more than 38,000 members in the SkillsUSA Association, California is the largest state for membership in the country. Now in its 52nd year hosting

a conference, this year's Ontario event featured more than 100 competitions based on technical skills for specific occupations. County students did a phenomenal job placing in the top three in dozens of events. Highlights included eight county students or teams winning gold medals at the competitions, which qualified them for SkillsUSA Nationals in Louisville, Ky., in June.

Victor Valley High School had three individual gold-medal winners - Ezekiel Elmore, Deja Rawles and Ernesto Zuniga.
