LOCAL, SMALL LOCAL AND SMALL LOCAL RESIDENT BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

District Modification: The District is modifying the LBU requirement for environmental site assessment services based on the availability analysis performed by the District's local business utilization consultant. The 25% SLBE portion of the District's 50% local business utilization requirement (referenced below) is waived. The minimum local business utilization requirement of 50% remains applicable.

The Local Business Utilization Policy 7115 requires that there is a mandatory fifty percent (50%) LBU participation with a 25% or less Local Business (LBE) participation and a 25% or more Small Local or Small Local Resident Business (SLBE/SLRBE) participation for all capital program/construction-related contracts and professional services agreements.

On April 28, 2021, the Board of Education amended the Local Business Policy which had named the City of Oakland as the singular agency to certify local businesses to include five additional local business certifications. For businesses located in Oakland, Local Business and Small Local Business certifications may also be accepted from the Port of Oakland, Alameda County Transportation Commission, Alameda County Department of General Services, US Department of Transportation California Unified Certification Program, and the California Public Utilities Commission. The District will follow the City of Oakland Small Business size standards in recognizing Small Local and Small Local Resident Businesses.

REQUEST FOR STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS AND FEE PROPOSALS

The purpose of this RFQ/P is to solicit statement of qualifications and fee proposals from environmental site assessment consulting firms for the McClymonds High School Modernization Project.

A. EXISTING SITE DESCRIPTION

McClymonds High School is located in West Oakland's Clawson neighborhood and has a site acreage of 10.7. The major site features include an all-weather surfaced track and synthetic turf football field, bleachers, outdoor swimming pool, tennis courts, and off-street parking lots.

The McClymonds High School campus consists of six existing buildings with a total building area of 168,115 s.f.

1. Building "A" was constructed in 1951. The two-story structure has a total area of 52,400 s.f. Within Building "A" are the school's Auditorium, Cafeteria, and classrooms.
2. Building "B" was constructed in 1951. The three-story structure has a total area of 29,684 s.f. The primary spaces within Building "B" are administrative offices and classrooms.
3. Building "H" was constructed in 1951. The three-story structure has a total area of 43,056 s.f. The primary spaces within Building "H" are classrooms.
4. Building floor levels are integral for Buildings "A", "B" and "H" with no seismic gaps.
5. Building "C" was constructed in 1957. The single story structure has a total area of 14,177 s.f. The primary spaces with Building "C" are classrooms and a clinic. Buildings "C" and "H" abut but are seismically separated.
6. Building "D" (Gymnasium) was constructed in 1957 as a freestanding structure. The single story building has a total area of 25,985 s.f.
7. Building "E" (Pool House) was constructed in 1977 as a freestanding structure. The single story building has a total area of 2,813 s.f.
8. Bleachers and ancillary spaces beneath was constructed according to drawings approved by the State of California (Department of Public Works/Division of Architecture) in 1958. Bleacher capacity is approximately 1,960 seats.

B. PROJECT SCOPE:

1. The modernization scope for the school campus shall include, but not be limited to, seismic upgrades to the Main Building (i.e., Buildings "A", "B" and "H") and annex buildings (i.e., Buildings "C" and Gymnasium).
2. Campus-wide systems upgrades shall include, but not be limited to, full domestic water replacement, modifications to HVAC, electrical, and sprinkler systems. Main Building shall also receive upgrades to its security system.
3. Upgrades to indoor spaces shall include finishes in the classrooms, hallways, restrooms, and cafeteria.
4. Project scope in the Gymnasium shall include reconfiguration and upgrades to the locker rooms, coaches' offices, and restrooms.
5. Project scope in Building "C" shall include upgrades to finishes of the woodshop and the space for the engineering pathway lab.

6. Upgrades to outdoor spaces shall include replacement of the bleachers and ancillary spaces beneath them as well as enhancements to the "Plaza of Peace" and garden areas.

C. ENVIRONMENTAL SITE ISSUES:

In early 2020, the chemical compound trichloroethylene (TCE) was found in groundwater beneath the school. The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) records indicated that there were five active cleanup sites within 2,000 feet of McClymonds High School which warranted a state response. One of the major concerns with TCE was the potential for "vapor intrusion," where chemicals in groundwater or soil vaporize and migrate into the buildings and air above. Both state and county officials had confirmed that the compound came from offsite.

OUSD retained the services of Professional Service Industries, Inc. (PSI) to prepare a site investigation report and coordinate its findings with the California Environmental Protection Agency (CAL/EPA) Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC). Their report also included an analysis of tetrachloroethene (PCE) which was detected in the groundwater and soil vapor. Based on the analyses, TCE and PCE were not detected in any of the confirmation indoor and outdoor air samples collected.

The Final Report, dated March 13, 2020, concluded that;

1. The results of indoor air samples collected from student and staff-occupied areas did not suggest that TCE or PCE had adversely impacted McClymonds High School or suggested concern with the occupation or normal use of the school.
2. The indoor air with respect to TCE and PCE were acceptable for the re-occupancy of the school.

The report provided the following recommendations;

1. PSI recommended that an additional, regional groundwater investigation be conducted to determine the source of the contamination in groundwater.
2. PSI recommended that OUSD evaluate and implement engineering controls for the boiler room sump to mitigate this conduit to indoor air.
3. PSI recommended that OUSD perform monitoring of indoor and outdoor air concentrations on a quarterly basis to confirm that TCE and PCE concentrations remain below regulatory health screening levels.
4. PSI recommended that OUSD evaluate and implement engineering controls to help reduce indoor-air concentrations of carbon tetrachloride and chloroform.

DTSC provided an approval letter, dated March 16, 2020, with the following statement:

"The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) has reviewed and approves the Site Investigation Report (Report) for McClymonds High School, located at 2607 Myrtle Street, in Oakland. The Report describes the investigation of groundwater, soil vapor, indoor and outdoor air, and drinking water at McClymonds High School with the objective of determining whether students and staff at the McClymonds are at risk from contaminants discovered in groundwater underlying the high school. The investigation also aimed at understanding the concentrations and occurrence of the contaminants in groundwater, soil vapor, indoor and outdoor air, and drinking water. With this information, DTSC and the Oakland Unified School District could identify additional actions needed for the long-term protections of students and staff at McClymonds High School.

DTSC concurs with the Report's conclusion that the re-occupancy of the school is acceptable because the contaminants of concern, trichloroethene (TCE) and

tetrachloroethene (PCE) were not detected in indoor air. DTSC also concurs with the conclusions and recommendations in the Report, including the recommendations for additional investigation of the groundwater, a study of the utility corridor, engineering controls, and quarterly indoor air monitoring at the school to confirm that TCE and PCE concentrations remain below regulatory health screening levels”.

Air monitoring is being performed on a semi-annual basis. The Semi-Annual 2024 Air Monitoring Report by Professional Service Industries, Inc. (PSI) dated June 26, 2024 can be found in the Reference Document shared folder.

Lead in water testing for potable water sources is conducted on a quarterly basis. The Water Testing Report by SCA Environmental, Inc. dated May 24, 2024 can be found in the Reference Document shared folder.

E. BASIC SERVICES

The Consultant shall agree to provide the Services described below:

1. The Consultant shall be responsible for the professional quality and technical accuracy of all reports, drawings, recommendations and other services furnished by the Consultant under the Agreement as well as design coordination. The Consultant shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors or omissions in its reports, drawings, recommendations and other services.
2. The Consultant will use all due care and diligence to confirm that its reports, drawings, recommendations and all other information provided by or on behalf of the District to potential bidders discloses and publishes any potentially relevant information that could, in any way, have an impact on a Contractor's cost of performance. The Consultant shall advise the District of the most effective methods of identifying and securing such information as part of each stage of design. The Consultant shall track for District's benefit all such suggested and disclosed information.
3. **Mandatory Assistance.** If a third party dispute or litigation, or both, arises out of, or relates in any way to the Services provided under this Agreement, upon the District's request, the Consultant, its agents, officers, and employees agree to assist in resolving the dispute or litigation. The Consultant's assistance includes, but is not limited to, providing professional consultations, attending mediations, arbitrations, depositions, trials or any event related to the dispute resolution and/or litigation (“Mandatory Assistance”).

F. INSURANCE

Insurance (Mandatory Requirements). Attach a letter from your insurance company or a certificate of liability insurance (“ACORD”) indicating your firm’s ability to provide insurance as required in the attached agreement, including but not limited to the following:

1. A.M. Best financial strength rating (FSR) of A- or better.
2. Commercial General Liability Insurance: Commercial general Liability Insurance shall be at least as broad as Insurance Services office General Liability Coverage (Occurrence Form CG 0001), with coverage limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage/ Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate.
3. Automobile Liability Insurance: Automobile liability insurance shall be at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering Automobile Liability, Code 1 (any auto), with coverage limits of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury and property damage each accident limit.
4. Workers’ Compensation and Employer’s Liability Insurance: The selected Architect shall insure (or be a qualified self-insured) under the applicable laws relating to workers’ compensation insurance, all of their employees working on the Project, in accordance with the “Workers Compensation and Insurance Act,” Division IV of the California Labor Code. The selected Architect shall provide employer’s liability insurance in the amount of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident for bodily injury and disease.
5. Errors and Omissions Insurance: Errors and omissions insurance shall be provided on an occurrence or claims-made basis with a limit of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) with a deductible in an amount not to exceed the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000)/ Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate.
6. All insurance will be in a form and with insurance companies acceptable to the District.
7. Insurance carriers shall be qualified to do business in California and maintain an agent for process within the State.

G. STATEMENT OF WORK:

It is anticipated that the Scope of Services for this Project will include but not limited to the following:

The Phase I ESA activities shall include but not limited to the following:

1. Prepare Phase I ESA in accordance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency’s (US EPA) All Appropriate Inquiries (AAI) Final Rule and ASTM E 1527-13.
2. Preparation of the Phase I ESA shall include but not limited to obtaining and reviewing environmental documents including those with historical and regulatory background information to evaluate the presence of known or suspected hazardous substances.
3. Preparation of the Phase I ESA shall include obtaining and reviewing Federal, State, Local and Tribal Records out to distances specified by the ASTM 1528 and AAI Standards.
4. Preparation of the Phase I ESA shall include but not limited to examining municipal and/or county planning files to check prior land usage and permits granted.
5. Consultant shall conduct file searches with public agencies (i.e., state water board, fire department, county health department, etc.) having oversight relative to water quality and soil contamination issues.

6. Review of environmental database reports shall determine if the site and adjoining properties stored or used hazardous materials or were responsible for any leaks and spills of hazardous substances.
7. Consultant shall examine chain of title for environmental liens and/or activity and land use limitations.
8. Consultant shall perform on-site reconnaissance to view present conditions (chemical spill residue, die-back of vegetation, etc.); hazardous substances or petroleum products usage (presence of above ground or underground storage tanks (UST), storage of acids, etc.); pesticide use; lead-based paint; polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB) associated with transformers and other electrical equipment; evaluate any likely environmentally hazardous site history.
9. Based on on-site reconnaissance, the Consultant shall prepare a list of potential contaminants including hazardous materials and their sources.
10. Contaminants/hazardous materials from above and below ground sources shall be identified and evaluated for potential impacts to indoor air quality.
11. Consultant shall examine historic aerial photography of the vicinity.
12. Consultant shall examine current USGS maps to analyze drainage patterns and topography.
13. Consultant shall interview persons knowledgeable regarding the property history (i.e., key shareholders including present users, regulatory and District personnel, neighbors, etc.) and request any environmental reports or information available.
14. Consultant shall prepare a Phase I ESA report which shall include an Executive Summary, conclusions and recommendations regarding potential site recognized environmental conditions (REC), figures and appendices with historical and regulatory information. Reports must be prepared and signed by Environmental Professional preparers who meet the ASTM E1527-13 parameters to perform Phase I ESAs.
15. Consultant shall prepare recommendations for conducting a Phase II ESA which would include physically evaluating areas of potential impacts based on the findings, conclusions and recognized environmental conditions (RECs) in the Phase I ESA.
16. Consultant shall advise the District on the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) procedures and requirements for Phase II based on the Phase I ESA findings.

H. DELIVERABLES

The progress and final reports shall be submitted via email in PDF format.

I. LIMITATIONS

1. This RFQ/P is not an offer by the District to contract with any party responding to this RFQ/P. The District reserves the right to add additional Respondents for consideration after distribution of this RFQ/P if it is found to be in the best interest of the District. All decisions concerning the selection will be made in the best interests of the District. The awarding of the contract pursuant to this RFQ/P, if at all, is at the sole discretion of the District.
2. The District makes no representation that participation in the RFQ/P process will lead to an award of contract or any consideration whatsoever. The District shall in no event

be responsible for the cost of preparing any RFQ/P Packet in response to this RFQ/P. RFQ/P Packets and any other supporting materials submitted to the District in response to this RFQ/P will not be returned and will become the property of the District unless portions of the materials are designated as proprietary at the time of submittal, and are specifically requested to be returned. Vague designations and/or blanket statements regarding entire pages or documents are insufficient and will not bind the District to protect the designated matter from disclosure. Pursuant to *Michaelis, Montanari, & Johnson v. Superior Court* (2006) 38 Cal.4th 1065, RFQ/P Packets shall be held confidential by the District and shall not be subject to disclosure under the California Public Records Act until after either: (1) the District and the successful Respondent have completed negotiations and entered into an Agreement, or (2) the District has rejected all Proposals.

3. Furthermore, the District will have no liability to the Respondent or other party as a result of any public disclosure of any RFQ/P Packet.

J. RESTRICTIONS ON LOBBYING AND CONTACTS

From the period beginning on the date of the issuance of this RFQ/P and ending on the date of the award of the contract for the project and/or notification of pre-qualified status, no person, or entity submitting in response to this RFQ/P, nor any officer, employee, representative, agent, or consultant representing such a person or entity shall contact through any means or engage in any discussion regarding this RFQ/P, the evaluation or selection process/or the award of the contract with any member of the District, Governing Board, selection members, or any member of the Citizens' Oversight Committee. Any such contact shall be grounds for the disqualification of the Respondent submitting a RFQ/P Packet.

K. STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS AND FEE PROPOSAL

1. General Information / Instructions

- 1.1 The District is inviting Fee Proposals for the "Project" which shall require coordination, administration, consulting and advice, and related services.
- 1.2 The District seeks to identify teams with a record of excellence in efficient planning and project delivery. The firms must have extensive experience related to educational facilities.
- 1.3 The Statement of Qualification and Fee Proposal must contain all requested information and must be on no larger than 8 1/2 x 11 paper and no more than fifteen (15) printed pages in length. The 15-page limit (as if printed single sided) shall address Sections 2.1 thru 2.4 below. The Statement of Qualification shall provide an insightful, straightforward, and concise overview of the capabilities of firm and its Sub-consultants.

2. Content – Statement of Qualifications and Fee Proposal

- 2.1 **Letter of Interest** - A dated Letter of Interest must be submitted, including the legal name of the firm(s), address, telephone and fax numbers, email address(es), and the name, title, and signature of the person(s) authorized to submit the Statement of Qualifications on behalf of the firm. The Letter of

Interest should provide a brief statement of firm's experience indicating the unique background and qualities of the firm, its personnel, and its Sub-consultants, and what will make the firm a good fit for work in the District. The letter shall also include the following statements:

"[RESPONDENT'S NAME] received a copy of the District's Agreement attached as **EXHIBIT A** to the RFQ/P. [RESPONDENT'S NAME] has reviewed the indemnity provisions in **EXHIBIT A** and insurance requirements contained in the Agreement. If given the opportunity to contract with the District, [RESPONDENT'S NAME] has no objections to the use of the Agreement."

Respondent shall certify that no official or employee of the District, nor any business entity in which an official of the District has an interest, has been employed or retained to solicit or assist in the procuring of the resulting contract(s), nor that any such person will be employed in the performance of any/all contract(s) without immediate divulgence of this fact to the District.

2.2 Firm Information

Narrative - Provide a narrative of the services offered by firm. The narrative should include all of the following:

2.2.1 Provide a brief history of firm, team firms, and, if a joint venture, of each participating firm. Identify legal form, ownership, and senior officials of company(ies). Describe number of years in business and types of business conducted.

2.2.2 Describe staffing capacity and resources to perform the scope of work. Provide resume(s) of those to be assigned to the Project as the Project Manager and/or Assistant(s) in an Appendix.

2.2.3 Discuss the firm's/team's ability to meet schedules for comparable projects, firm's schedule management procedures, and how the firm has successfully handled potential agency approval delays.

2.2.4 Identify K-12 projects performed by firm in the past three (3) years. Limit response to no more than the twenty (20) most recent projects. Please include the following information for each project

2.2.4.1 Name of project and client,

2.2.4.2 Scope of projects, description of services provided,

2.2.4.3 Contact person, telephone number, and email address,

2.2.4.4 Firm person in charge of each project,

2.2.4.5 Construction dollar value of each project.

2.2.5 Scope of Work

Provide a detailed description of the services provided into sections including but not limited to statement of work described in Section G.

2.3 Litigation. All litigation arising from project(s), if any, in the past five (5) years. State the issues in the litigation, the status of litigation, names of parties, and outcome.

2.4 Professional Fees

Firms shall provide a detailed fee proposal.

- 2.4.1** Include a line item for a 10% contingency to the proposed fee. The proposed fee with the 10% contingency will be considered the not-to-exceed fee for the Project. The contingency will be to cover potential additional services and shall be subject to District approval.

Breakdown of Fee Proposal shall be submitted as follows:

1. Proposed Fee with a detailed hourly breakdown by task
2. Contingency of 10% of Proposed Fee
3. Not-to-Exceed Fee (Proposed Fee plus 10% Contingency)

- 2.4.2** Provide a detailed schedule of the Consultant's and Sub-consultant's hourly billing rates and a breakdown of associated costs for all tasks proposed (including contingency costs per task). Also note the time period that the fee schedule would apply and shall include the period covering the project duration.

- 2.4.3** The District reserves the right to negotiate different rates submitted with the RFP prior to the execution of the agreement.

- 2.5 Additional Data** - Provide additional information about the firm as it may relate to the Statement of Qualifications. These may include any other data that may assist the District in understanding firm's qualifications, capacity and/or expertise. This additional data shall be in an Appendix and will not be counted in the fifteen page limit.

L. DISTRICT'S EVALUATION / SELECTION PROCESS

- 1.** Submittals will be reviewed for responsiveness and evaluated pursuant to established objective criteria, with particular attention to, without limitation, each respondent's qualifications, demonstrated competence in like construction, and the Firm's ability to integrate its personnel with the District's staff and consultants.
- 2.** After the submittals are evaluated and/or ranked, the District, at its sole discretion, may elect to interview the top Firm(s). The District may elect to interview one or more Firms. Any firm(s) selected for interviews must make available for interview the key personnel it intends to assign to the District's Project(s). Any comments or objections to the form of Agreement attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A** to this RFQ/P shall be provided in writing before the interview and may be the subject of inquiry at the interview. Any comments or objections to the form of Agreement not provided in writing before the interview will not be entertained by the District. Adequate time will be allowed for presentation of qualifications followed by questions and answers.
- 3. District Investigations** - The District may check references, and may perform investigations of firm that extend beyond the information in the proposals. The District may conduct interviews of firms.

M. FINAL DETERMINATION AND AWARD

- 1.** The District reserves the right to contract with any entity responding to this RFQ/P, to reject any proposal as non-responsive, and not to contract with any firm for the services described herein. The District reserves the right to seek proposals from or to contract with any firm not participating in this process. The District reserves the right to reject any or all submissions, to request further information, to negotiate with any firm, to extend the submission deadline, or to amend or cancel in part or in its entirety this RFQ/P. This RFQ/P does not commit the District to award a contract or to reimburse any firm for costs incurred in submitting a proposal.
- 2.** The awarding of contract(s) is at the sole discretion of the District. The District may, at its option, determine to award contracts only for portions of the scope of work. In such case, the successful proposing firm will be given the option not to agree to enter into the Agreement and the District will retain the right to negotiate with any other proposing firm selected as a finalist. If no finalist is willing to enter into a contract for the reduced scope of work, the District will retain the right to enter into negotiations with any other Respondent responding to this RFQ/P.
- 3.** The RFQ/P packet, and any other supporting materials submitted to the District in response to this RFQ/P will not be returned and will become the property of the District unless portions of the materials are designated as proprietary at the time of submittal, and are specifically requested to be returned. This RFQ/P does not commit the District to negotiate an agreement with any proposing firm or individual.

FORM OF AGREEMENT (SPECIMEN)

**OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT
GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT**

This general services agreement (“Agreement”) is made and entered into effective _____, 20__ (the “Effective Date”), by and between the Oakland Unified School District (“District”) and _____ (“Contractor” and together with District, the “Parties”).

1. **Contractor Services.** Contractor agrees to provide the following services to District (collectively, the “Basic Services”): For the _____ project (“Project”), _____ (as further described in *Exhibit A* to this Agreement). Contractor shall provide services related to the Project other than Basic Services (i.e., “Additional Services”) if directed in writing by District to perform specific Additional Services and if sufficient contract funds for Additional Services remain to pay for the directed Additional Services (see Section 5, below). “Services” shall mean Basic and Additional Services. Contractor agrees to perform such Services as expeditiously as is consistent with professional skill and care and the orderly progress of the Services and the Project. All services performed by the Contractor under this Agreement shall be conducted in a manner consistent with the level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by _____ consultants specially qualified to provide the services required by the District.

2. **Contractor Qualifications.** Contractor represents and warrants to District that Contractor, and all of Contractor’s employees, agents or volunteers (the “Contractor Parties”), have in effect and shall maintain in full force throughout the Term of this Agreement all licenses, credentials, permits and any other qualifications required by law to perform the Services and to fully and faithfully satisfy all of the terms set forth in this Agreement. Contractor and any Contractor Parties performing Services shall be competent to perform those Services.

3. **Term.** The term for performance of the Services shall be the duration of the Project (“Term”), except as otherwise stated in Section 4 below, and Contractor shall complete the Services within the Term. There shall be no extension of the Term without an amendment signed by all Parties and approved by the District’s governing board. Written notice by the District Superintendent or designee shall be sufficient to stop further performance of the Services by Contractor or the Contractor Parties. In the event of early termination, Contractor shall be paid for satisfactory Services performed to the date of termination. Upon payment by District, District shall be under no further obligation to Contractor, monetarily or otherwise, and District may proceed with the work in any manner District deems proper.

4. **Termination.** Either Party may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other Party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, District may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving written notice to Contractor if (1) Contractor materially breaches any of the terms of this Agreement; (2) any act or omission of Contractor or the Contractor Parties exposes District to potential liability or may cause an increase in District’s insurance premiums; (3) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt; (4) Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors; (5) a receiver is appointed because of Contractor’s insolvency; or (6) Contractor or Contractor Parties fail to comply with or make material representations as to the fingerprinting, criminal background check,

and/or tuberculosis certification sections of this Agreement. Such termination shall be effective immediately upon Contractor's receipt of the notice.

5. **Payment of Fees for Services.** District agrees to pay Contractor based on the hourly rates listed in *Exhibit B* for Services satisfactorily performed. Contractor shall not increase these hourly rates over the course of this Agreement. Total fees paid by District to Contractor for Services under the Agreement shall not exceed _____ Dollars (\$ _____), which consists of a not-to-exceed amount of _____ Dollars (\$ _____) for performance of the Basic Services, and a not-to-exceed contingency amount of _____ Dollars (\$ _____) for performance of any Additional Services. Contractor acknowledges that the not-to-exceed fee for Basic Services, above, includes contingency compensation in the foreseeable event that more time and costs may be necessary to complete the Basic Services. Contractor shall perform all Basic Services required by the Agreement even if the not-to-exceed amount for performance of the Services has already been paid and no more payments will be forthcoming. District agrees to make payment within sixty (60) days of receipt of a detailed invoice from Contractor based on hours worked and hourly rates, including any additional supporting documentation that District reasonably requests. Contractor shall not submit its invoices to District more frequently than monthly. Contractor will not be compensated for any Basic or Additional Services required as a result of wrongful acts or omissions.

5.1 **Reimbursement for Certain Expenses.** Contractor shall not be reimbursed directly for any of its expenses, as the fees to be paid under this Agreement include compensation for any and all of Contractor's expenses.

6. **Indemnity.** Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless District and its agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, Board of Trustees, members of the Board of Trustees (collectively, the "District Parties"), from and against any and all claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, suits and actions, and expenses (including, but not limited to attorney fees and costs including fees of consultants) of any kind, nature and description (collectively, the "Claims") directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from any act, error, omission, negligence, or willful misconduct of Contractor, the Contractor Parties or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees in the performance of or failure to perform Contractor's obligations under this Agreement, including, but not limited to Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' use of the site, Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' performance of the Services, Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' breach of any of the representations or warranties contained in this Agreement, or for injury to or death of persons or damage to property or delay or damage to the District or the District Parties. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or reduce other rights or obligations of indemnity, which would otherwise exist as to a party, person, or entity described in this paragraph. The indemnification provided for in this Section 6 includes, without limitation to the foregoing, claims that may be made against District by any taxing authority asserting that an employer-employee relationship exists by reason of this Agreement, and any claims made against District alleging civil rights violations by Contractor or Contractor Parties under the California Fair Employment and Housing Act ("FEHA").

7. **Equipment and Materials.** Contractor at its sole cost and expense shall provide and furnish all tools, labor, materials, equipment, transportation services and any other items (collectively, "Equipment") which are required or necessary to perform the Services in a manner which is consistent with generally accepted standards of the profession for similar services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, District shall not be responsible for any damages to persons or property as a result of the

use, misuse or failure of any Equipment used by Contractor or the Contractor Parties, even if such Equipment is furnished, rented or loaned to Contractor or the Contractor Parties by District. Furthermore, District may reject any Equipment or workmanship that does not conform to the requirements of this Agreement and Contractor must then promptly remedy or replace it at no additional cost to District and subject to District's reasonable satisfaction.

8. **Insurance.** Without in any way limiting Contractor's liability, or indemnification obligations set forth in Section 6 above, Contractor shall secure and maintain throughout the Term of this Agreement the following insurance: (i) comprehensive general liability insurance with limits of not less than \$_____ each occurrence and \$_____ in the aggregate; (ii) commercial automobile liability insurance with limits not less than \$_____ each occurrence and \$_____ in the aggregate; (iii) worker's compensation insurance as required by Labor Code section 3200, *et seq.*; and (iv) professional liability insurance covering errors and omissions.

Neither Contractor nor any of the Contractor Parties shall commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverages have been delivered to and approved by District. All insurance policies shall include an endorsement stating that District and District Parties are named additional insureds. All of the policies shall be amended to provide that the insurance shall not be suspended, voided, canceled, reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to District. If such a notice is not given or even if District receives a notice, District may, at its sole option, terminate this Agreement. All insurance policies shall include an endorsement stating that it is primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District and shall waive all rights of subrogation against District and/or the District Parties. A copy of the declarations page of Contractor's insurance policies shall be attached to this Agreement as proof of insurance.

9. **Independent Contractor Status.** The Parties agree that Contractor is free from the control and direction of District in connection with Contractor's performance of the Services. Contractor is hereby retained to provide the specified Services for District, which are outside the usual course of District's business. Contractor certifies that it is customarily engaged in an independently established trade, occupation, or business to provide the Services required by this Agreement. Contractor understands and agrees that Contractor and the Contractor Parties shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partners, or joint venturers of District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled.

10. **Taxes.** All payments made by District to Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be reported to the applicable federal and state taxing authorities as required. Unless required by law, District will not withhold any money from fees payable to Contractor, including FICA (social security), state or federal unemployment insurance contributions, or state or federal income tax or disability insurance. If applicable, Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor and the Contractor Parties and otherwise in connection with this Agreement.

11. **Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification.** Contractor and the Contractor Parties shall at all times comply with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of the California Education Code ("Education Code") section 45125.1. Before performing any Services, Contractor shall execute and return the District's Fingerprinting

Notice and Acknowledgement form and the required certification (see *Exhibit C*).

Contractor further agrees and acknowledges that if at any time during the Term of this Agreement Contractor learns or becomes aware of additional information which differs in any way from the information learned or provided pursuant to Section 45125.1, or Contractor or Contractor Parties add personnel who will provide Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall immediately notify District and prohibit any new personnel from interacting with District students until the fingerprinting and background check requirements have been satisfied and District determines whether any interaction is permissible.

12. **Tuberculosis Certification.** Contractor and the Contractor Parties shall at all times comply with the tuberculosis (“TB”) certification requirements of Education Code section 49406. Accordingly, by checking the applicable boxes below, Contractor hereby represents and warrants to District the following:

A. Contractor and Contractor Parties will **only have limited contact or no contact** (as determined by District) with District students at all times during the Term of this Agreement.

B. The following Contractor and Contractor Parties will have **more than limited contact** (as determined by District) with District students during the Term of this Agreement and, at no cost to District, have received a TB test or risk assessment in full compliance with the requirements of Education Code section 49406:

Contractor shall maintain on file the certificates showing that the Contractor and Contractor Parties were examined and found free from active TB. These forms shall be regularly maintained and updated by Contractor and shall be available to District upon request or audit.

Contractor further agrees and acknowledges that all new personnel hired to provide Services under this Agreement after the Effective Date of this Agreement by Contractor and Contractor Parties are subject to the TB certification requirements of Education Code section 49406 and shall be prohibited from having any contact with District students until the TB certification requirements have been satisfied and District determines whether any contact is permissible.

13. **Confidential Information.** All District information disclosed to Contractor during the course of performance of services under this Agreement shall be treated as confidential and shall not be disclosed to any other persons or parties excepts as authorized by District or required by law. Contractor shall maintain the confidentiality of, and protect from unauthorized disclosure, any and all individual student information received from the District, including but not limited to student names and other identifying information. Contractor shall not use such student information for any purpose other than carrying out the obligations under this Agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement, Contractor shall turn over to District all educational records related to the Services provided to any District student pursuant to this Agreement.

14. **Assignment/Successors and Assigns.** Contractor shall not assign or transfer by operation of law

or otherwise any or all of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of District. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding on the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the respective Parties.

15. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Agreement.

16. **Amendments.** The terms of this Agreement shall not be waived, altered, modified, supplemented or amended in any manner whatsoever except by written agreement signed by both Parties and approved by the District's governing board.

17. **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California, excluding its choice of law rules. Any action or proceeding seeking any relief under or with respect to this Agreement shall be brought solely in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Alameda, subject to transfer of venue under applicable State law, provided that nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of immunity to suit by the District.

18. **Written Notice.** Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to Contractor at the address located next to the party signatures below, or if delivered at or sent by registered or certified or overnight mail to the last business address known to the person who sends the notice.

19. **Compliance with Law.** Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted into this Agreement shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Agreement shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein. Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances, including but not limited to fingerprinting under Education Code section 45125.1 and confidentiality of records. Contractor agrees that it shall comply with all legal requirements for the performance of duties under this Agreement and that failure to do so shall constitute material breach.

20. **Non-Discrimination.** There shall be no unlawful discrimination in the contracting of persons under this Agreement because of race, color, national origin, age, ancestry, religion, sex, or sexual orientation of such persons.

21. **Attorneys' Fees.** If a party to this Agreement commences a legal action against the other party to enforce a provision of this Agreement or seek damages related to the services provided under this Agreement, the prevailing party in the legal action will be entitled to recover from the other party all of its reasonable litigation expense, costs, and fees actually incurred, including reasonable attorneys' and experts' fees.

22. **Liability of District.** Notwithstanding anything stated herein to the contrary, District shall not be liable for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including but not limited to lost profits in connection with this Agreement.

23. **Time.** Time is of the essence for performance of the Services under this Agreement.

24. **Waiver.** No delay or omission by either Party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right and no single or partial exercise of any right shall preclude either Party from any or further exercise of any right or remedy.

25. **Reports.** Contractor shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to the Services rendered and the costs incurred under this Agreement, including records with respect to any payments to employees and subcontractors. All such records shall be prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures. Upon request, Contractor shall make such records available to District for the purpose of auditing and copying such records for a period of five years from the date of final payment under this Agreement.

26. **Ownership of Documents.** All plans, studies, drawings, calculations, reports, specifications, estimates, and other documents or any other works of authorship fixed in any tangible medium of expression, including but not limited to physical drawings, data magnetically or otherwise recorded on computer disks, or other writings prepared or caused to be prepared by the Contractor under this Agreement (“Documents”) shall be and shall remain the property of the District for all purposes, not only as they relate or may relate to the Services but as they relate or may relate to any other project. Contractor will provide the District with a complete set of Documents, and will retain, on the District's behalf, the originals or reproducible copies of all Documents, however stored, in the Contractor's files for a period of no less than fifteen (15) years. Contractor shall promptly make available to District any original documents it has retained under this Agreement upon request by the District.

27. **Licensing of Intellectual Property.** This Agreement creates a non-exclusive and perpetual license for the District to copy, use, modify, reuse or sublicense any and all copyrights, designs and other intellectual property embodied in the Documents (“Intellectual Property”) not only as they relate or may relate to the Services but as they relate or may relate to other projects. The Contractor shall require any and all subcontractors and subconsultants to agree in writing that the District is granted a similar non-exclusive and perpetual license for the Intellectual Property of such subcontractors or consultants that they provided to Contractor as part of the Services. The compensation for the Services includes compensation not only for any such use of the Intellectual Property in connection with the Services, but also for any re-use of the Intellectual Property by the District in relation to other projects. Contractor represents and warrants that Contractor has the legal right to license the Intellectual Property that Contractor, its subcontractors, or its subconsultants prepare or cause to be prepared under this Agreement.

28. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement is intended by the Parties as the final expression of their agreement with respect to such terms as are included herein and as the complete and exclusive statement of its terms and may not be contradicted by evidence of any prior agreement or of a contemporaneous oral agreement, nor explained or supplemented by evidence of consistent additional terms.

29. **Ambiguity.** The Parties to this Agreement, and each of them, hereby represent that the language contained herein is to be construed as jointly proposed and jointly accepted, and in the event of any subsequent determination of ambiguity, all Parties shall be treated as equally responsible for such ambiguity.

30. **Execution of Other Documents.** The Parties to this Agreement shall cooperate fully in the execution of any and all other documents and in the completion of any additional actions that may be

necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of this Agreement.

31. **Execution in Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts such that the signatures may appear on separate signature pages. A copy, facsimile, or an original, with all signatures appended together, shall be deemed a fully executed agreement.

32. **Warranty of Authority.** The persons who have signed this Agreement warrant that they are legally authorized to do so on behalf of the respective parties, and by their signatures to bind the respective parties to this Agreement.

33. **Mediation.** A party to this Agreement shall, as a condition precedent to initiating any litigation against the other party, demand mediation of any dispute. The parties shall endeavor to include any third party claimant in the mediation. The parties shall select a mediator and schedule the mediation within thirty (30) days of the initial demand for mediation. If the parties cannot agree on a mediator, the mediator shall be appointed by JAMS. The parties to the mediation, including the parties to this Agreement, shall pay equal shares of the mediator's fees. Each party shall bear its own attorney's fees related to the mediation.

34. **Forms.** Prior to performing any Services, Contractor shall prepare, execute, and submit all forms that may be required by law for this Agreement, including but not limited to disabled veteran business enterprises ("DVBE") certification (Education Code §17076.11) and an Iran Contract Act certification (Public Contract Code §2204). If a form is necessary, Contractor shall use the District's versions of these forms, which the District shall make available upon request.

35. **Sanctions in Response to Russian Aggression.** The District requires Contractor to comply with the Governor's March 4, 2022, Executive Order N-6-22 ("Order") relating to any existing sanctions imposed by the United States government and the State of California in response to Russia's actions in Ukraine, including additional requirements for contracts of \$5 million or more. Failure to comply may result in the termination of the Contract.

36. **Designation of Key Personnel.** The individuals specified in the attached *Exhibit D* shall provide the services set forth herein, and shall be the persons primarily in charge of such work. No other individuals may provide services for Contractor on the this project without first obtaining the written approval of the City Manager.

37. **Conflict of Interest.** Contractor warrants that neither Contractor nor any of its employees, agents, or subcontractors has an actual or potential conflict of interest with the District in respect to the Services to be performed under this Agreement for the District. None of such individuals shall, during this term of this Agreement, acquire any interest which conflicts, or could potentially conflict, in any manner with the interests of the District.

38. **Notice to Proceed; Progress; Completion.** Upon execution of this Agreement by the parties and approval of it by the District's governing board, District shall give Contractor written notice to proceed with the Services. Such notice may authorize Contractor to render all of the Services contemplated herein, or such portions or phases as may be directed by the District. In the latter event, District shall, in its sole discretion, issue subsequent notices from time to time regarding further portions or phases of the Services. Upon receipt of such notices, Contractor shall diligently proceed with the Services authorized and complete it within the agreed time period.

FINGERPRINTING NOTICE AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT
FOR CONTRACTS OTHER THAN CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS

(Education Code Section 45125.1)

Other than business entities performing construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or repair who have complied with Education Code section 45125.2, business entities entering into contracts with the District must comply with Education Code sections 45125.1. Such entities are responsible for ensuring full compliance with the law and should therefore review all applicable statutes and regulations. The following information is provided simply to assist such entities with compliance with the law:

1. You (as a business entity) shall ensure that each of your employees who interacts with pupils outside of the immediate supervision and control of the pupil's parent or guardian or a school employee has a valid criminal records summary as described in Education Code section 44237. (Education Code §45125.1(a).) You shall do the same for any other employees as directed by the District. (Education Code §45125.1(c).) When you perform the criminal background check, you shall immediately provide any subsequent arrest and conviction information it receives to the District pursuant to the subsequent arrest service. (Education Code §45125.1(a).)
2. You shall not permit an employee to interact with pupils until the Department of Justice has ascertained that the employee has not been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45122.1. (Education Code §45125.1(e).) See the lists of violent and serious felonies in *Attachment A* to this Notice.
3. Prior to performing any work or services under your contract with the District, and prior to being present on District property or being within the vicinity of District pupils, you shall certify in writing to the District under the penalty of perjury that neither the employer nor any of its employees who are required to submit fingerprints, and who may interact with pupils, have been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45122.1, and that you are in full compliance with Education Code section 45125.1. (Education Code §45125.1(f).) For this certification, you shall use the form in *Attachment B* to this Notice.
4. If you are providing the above services in an emergency or exceptional situation, you are not required to comply with Education Code section 45125.1, above. An "emergency or exceptional" situation is one in which pupil health or safety is endangered or when repairs are needed to make a facility safe and habitable. The District shall determine whether an emergency or exceptional situation exists. (Education Code §45125.1(b).)
5. If you are an individual operating as a sole proprietor of a business entity, you are considered an employee of that entity for purposes of Education Code section 45125.1, and the District shall prepare and submit your fingerprints to the Department of Justice as described in Education Code section 45125.1(a).

ATTACHMENT A

Violent and Serious Felonies

Under Education Code sections 45122.1 and 45125.1, no employee of a contractor or subcontractor who has been convicted of or has criminal proceedings pending for a violent or serious felony may come into contact with any student. A violent felony is any felony listed in subdivision (c) of Section 667.5 of the Penal Code. Those felonies are presently defined as:

- (1) Murder or voluntary manslaughter.
- (2) Mayhem.
- (3) Rape as defined in paragraph (2) or (6) of subdivision (a) of Section 261 or paragraph (1) or (4) of subdivision (a) of Section 262.
- (4) Sodomy as defined in subdivision (c) or (d) of Section 286.
- (5) Oral copulation as defined in subdivision (c) or (d) of Section 288a.
- (6) Lewd or lascivious act as defined in subdivision (a) or (b) of Section 288.
- (7) Any felony punishable by death or imprisonment in the state prison for life.
- (8) Any felony in which the defendant inflicts great bodily injury on any person other than an accomplice which has been charged and proved as provided for in Section 12022.7, 12022.8, or 12022.9 on or after July 1, 1977, or as specified prior to July 1, 1977, in Sections 213, 264, and 461, or any felony in which the defendant uses a firearm which use has been charged and proved as provided in subdivision (a) of Section 12022.3, or Section 12022.5 or 12022.55.
- (9) Any robbery.
- (10) Arson, in violation of subdivision (a) or (b) of Section 451.
- (11) Sexual penetration as defined in subdivision (a) or (j) of Section 289.
- (12) Attempted murder.
- (13) A violation of Section 18745, 18750, or 18755.
- (14) Kidnapping.
- (15) Assault with the intent to commit a specified felony, in violation of

Section 220.

- (16) Continuous sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Section 288.5.
- (17) Carjacking, as defined in subdivision (a) of Section 215.
- (18) Rape, spousal rape, or sexual penetration, in concert, in violation of Section 264.1.
- (19) Extortion, as defined in Section 518, which would constitute a felony violation of Section 186.22 of the Penal Code.
- (20) Threats to victims or witnesses, as defined in Section 136.1, which would constitute a felony violation of Section 186.22 of the Penal Code.
- (21) Any burglary of the first degree, as defined in subdivision (a) of Section 460, wherein it is charged and proved that another person, other than an accomplice, was present in the residence during the commission of the burglary.
- (22) Any violation of Section 12022.53.
- (23) A violation of subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11418.

A serious felony is any felony listed in subdivision (c) Section 1192.7 of the Penal Code. Those felonies are presently defined as:

- (1) Murder or voluntary manslaughter; (2) Mayhem; (3) Rape; (4) Sodomy by force, violence, duress, menace, threat of great bodily injury, or fear of immediate and unlawful bodily injury on the victim or another person; (5) Oral copulation by force, violence, duress, menace, threat of great bodily injury, or fear of immediate and unlawful bodily injury on the victim or another person; (6) Lewd or lascivious act on a child under the age of 14 years; (7) Any felony punishable by death or imprisonment in the state prison for life; (8) Any felony in which the defendant personally inflicts great bodily injury on any person, other than an accomplice, or any felony in which the defendant personally uses a firearm; (9) Attempted murder; (10) Assault with intent to commit rape, or robbery; (11) Assault with a deadly weapon or instrument on a peace officer; (12) Assault by a life prisoner on a non-inmate; (13) Assault with a deadly weapon by an inmate; (14) Arson; (15) Exploding a destructive device or any explosive with intent to injure; (16) Exploding a destructive device or any explosive causing bodily injury, great bodily injury, or mayhem; (17) Exploding a destructive device or any explosive with intent to murder; (18) Any burglary of the first degree; (19) Robbery or bank robbery; (20) Kidnapping; (21) Holding of a hostage by a person confined in a state prison; (22) Attempt to commit a felony punishable by death or imprisonment in the state prison for life; (23) Any felony in which the defendant personally used a dangerous or deadly weapon; (24) Selling, furnishing, administering, giving, or offering to sell, furnish, administer, or give to a minor any heroin, cocaine, phencyclidine (PCP), or any methamphetamine-related drug,

as described in paragraph (2) of subdivision (d) of Section 11055 of the Health and Safety Code, or any of the precursors of methamphetamines, as described in subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11055 or subdivision (a) of Section 11100 of the Health and Safety Code; (25) Any violation of subdivision (a) of Section 289 where the act is accomplished against the victim's will by force, violence, duress, menace, or fear of immediate and unlawful bodily injury on the victim or another person; (26) Grand theft involving a firearm; (27) carjacking; (28) any felony offense, which would also constitute a felony violation of Section 186.22; (29) assault with the intent to commit mayhem, rape, sodomy, or oral copulation, in violation of Section 220; (30) throwing acid or flammable substances, in violation of Section 244; (31) assault with a deadly weapon, firearm, machine gun, assault weapon, or semiautomatic firearm or assault on a peace officer or firefighter, in violation of Section 245; (32) assault with a deadly weapon against a public transit employee, custodial officer, or school employee, in violation of Sections 245.2, 245.3, or 245.5; (33) discharge of a firearm at an inhabited dwelling, vehicle, or aircraft, in violation of Section 246; (34) commission of rape or sexual penetration in concert with another person, in violation of Section 264.1; (35) continuous sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Section 288.5; (36) shooting from a vehicle, in violation of subdivision (c) or (d) of Section 26100; (37) intimidation of victims or witnesses, in violation of Section 136.1; (38) criminal threats, in violation of Section 422; (39) any attempt to commit a crime listed in this subdivision other than an assault; (40) any violation of Section 12022.53; (41) a violation of subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11418; and (42) any conspiracy to commit an offense described in this subdivision.
