General Information

Tamiscal is a warm, welcoming, supportive community where students thrive in a small personalized learning environment. That said, independent study is not for all pupils as it requires basic academic skills, as well as a level of commitment, motivation, organizational skills, and self-direction to make the satisfactory educational progress as required per EC sections 51747(g)(4) and 51749.5(a)(8).

Here are some of the highlights of our Independent Study program:

- College-prep academic classes
- Small classes and personalized learning experiences
- Positive school culture and climate
- Caring teachers and staff
- Flexible schedule
- Extra support provided on campus

Tamiscal is a best fit for:

- Students who can work successfully on an independent basis in a less structured environment (5 hours/class/week required)
- Students who prefer a small school setting
- Students who have unique academic, social, extra-curricular, or medical needs
- Students who want a flexible schedule

Tamiscal students must take at least 4 classes with us (<u>sample schedule</u>) and can complete all of their graduation requirements on site. We offer a limited number of <u>elective offerings</u> and do not offer honors or AP courses. Some students co-enroll at their home school or at College of Marin. We accept students 4 times per year and the <u>process begins with enrollment in your home school and a referral from your counselor</u>. Students coming in as 9th graders or from private schools can reach out directly to Tamiscal's counselor.

Important steps to change schools and what to expect:

- 1. Meet with the school counselor at your home school to learn more about Tamiscal
- 2. Complete the referral form (this form) and get all signatures
- 3. Write your student letter
- 4. Submit the completed form to your school counselor. Include any formal GE, IEP or 504 plans, if relevant. Include transcripts if coming from a private school.
- 5. Tamiscal will schedule an intake meeting with parent(s), student, and Tamiscal's counselor and principal.
- 6. At the intake meeting, we will ask questions to learn more about the student, share information, and answer questions about the school. We will also talk through a draft schedule. This is <u>not</u> an interview.
- 7. If best fit is determined, we will discuss the onboarding process to include an orientation and school tour.

Independent study is only available as a voluntary option chosen by pupils and parents; pupils cannot be assigned to independent study. Students who cannot complete the required instructional minutes of 240 minutes/day; or 5 hours of work/class/week may be referred back to their home school.
