## **<u>FINANCE</u>**: (Edward Hill, Chairperson)

-Some discussion centered on the Pilot money from the Township. Walter Maluchnik wanted to know how the dollar amount was derived and what was that number last year. Ambrose Duckett responded and said that the amount would cover programs that may have been eliminated. Last year's number was \$84,000.

- Len DiGiacomo wanted to know if that number was capped by the agreement and whether the agreement prevented the township from increasing the amount. The answer by Ambrose was that the number gave us some level of certainty for a few years which helps in budgeting.

On the motion by Edward Hill and seconded by Len DiGiacomo, the following action items were approved. Roll call vote. Motion carried

#### A. Action Items:

#### 1) Recommend the Board approve the following 2022-2023 budget/travel resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that the tentative budget be approved and certified for the 2022-2023 school year using the 2022-2023 state aid figures in addition to the additional Pilot Money from Eastampton Township The Secretary to the Board of Education be authorized to submit the following tentative budget (including the use of all automatic adjustments, if applicable) to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval in accordance with the statutory deadline.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held on April 26, 2022 at 7:00pm for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the proposed budget for the 2022-2023 school year.

#### TRAVEL RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS, the Eastampton Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers

the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel only, an annual school year threshold of \$150/staff member where prior Board approval shall not be required unless this annual threshold for a staff member is exceeded in a given school year (July 1-June 30); and

WHEREAS, travel and related expenses not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq., but deemed by the Board of Education to be necessary and unavoidable as noted on the approved Board of Education Out of District Travel and Reimbursement Forms; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves all travel not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq. as being necessary and unavoidable as noted on the approved Board of Education Out of District Travel and Reimbursement Forms; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.2(b), to a maximum expenditure of \$35,000 for all staff and board members.

# 2) Recommend the Board approve the following 2022-2023 resolution for a Capital Reserve Withdrawal – Other Capital Project:

Included in budget line 620, Budgeted Withdrawal from Capital Reserve is \$50,000 for a capital project upgrade the HVAC controls. The total cost of this project is estimated to be \$200,000 and with the balance funded by ESSER III.

Included in budget line 720, Budgeted Withdrawal from Maintenance Reserve \$70,000 for maintenance upgrades to our Middle School Gym and oversight
