- -Mrs. Szymanek inquired about the fiscal downturn and how it will impact the special education community. Mr. Duckett responded that several scenarios have been explored but that the students will not feel the impact. Mr. Forney indicated that special education cannot be impacted by the gap in funding. Mrs. Douglas asked when the state will announce the new funding amounts. Mr. Forney hoped that it would be publicized within the next month; however there is no stated timeline. Mrs. Douglas informed the Board that parents are willing to help in any way they can.
