Thursday, Dec. 2 at 2:45 p.m., cheerleaders will lead the LDE team through the hallways for other students to applaud and wish them luck in their state contest, which requires the team prepare and present a 5-8 minute program about FFA and what it represents, followed by a questionand-answer session.

In addition to the state-bound public relations team, Kenia Velazquez (11) placed seventh in Senior Spanish Creed Speaking at the area contest, and the Greenhand Chapter Conducting team of TJ Fowler (9), Porter Yohn (9), Abby Grace (9), Jacob Griffin (9), Madeline McGee (10), Rylee Aiken (9), Katherine Potter (10) and advisor Avery Brooks (12) placed eleventh.

Varsity Basketball Teams Busy With Back-to-Back Tournaments

The boys' basketball team will play the Spring Hill/White Oak tournament Dec. 2-4 steals from Gracie Stanford (11), Macey and the annual UG basketball tournament Dec. 16-18. Highly ranked teams such as Timpson and Garrison will compete. While district play doesn't begin until January, Coach Wilson has big expectations for this year's varsity team.

"I expect us to be a district title contender and to win the first playoff game," Wilson said.

The girls will play the McLeod tournament Dec. 2-4 and Gary's tournament Dec. 9-11.

The teams hosted their first pre-season basketball tournaments Nov. 18-20. The girls' varsity team succumbed to Pewitt in their Thursday game. The Lady Lions lost

The boys beat All Saints Episcopal School 50-47 in their first game of the tournament with three-pointers from Colton Cowan (11), Jace Roberts (9), Cooper Vestal (11) and Hunter Cannon (12). The Lions also blocked four All Saints shots and grabbed 44 rebounds. The boys lost 80-27 against Avinger in their second Thursday game, despite big plays from Cannon, Cowan, Aubrey Woodard (12), Jaxon Daniels (10), Harlee Kirbis (12), and Trevor Moore (12).

Friday, the Lady Lions beat Ore City 52-8, and then the girls topped Grand Saline 47-24. Stanford led the game in threepointers, and Wightman, Gracie Winn (11) and Stanford earned steals. The Lions played Quitman and All Saints Friday. UG lost 66-48 to Quitman despite steals from Woodard and Daniels and three-point shots from Cowan, Cannon, Roberts, and Vestal. All Saints capitalized on the teams' second meeting with a 51-43 win.

Dictionary Skills, Number Sense, Social Studies, Music Memory, and Modern Oratory begin at 10:40. Calculator Apps and Spelling start at 11:45, and Impromptu finals begin at 12:50, followed by Oral Reading finals, Science, Art, and Modern Oratory finals at 1:55. Listening Skills and Chess are the last contests of the day, beginning at 3 p.m.

Though Ready Writing and Editorial Writing participants wrote Dec. 1, judging for these events will also take place Dec. 8.

"I think that we will come out in the top three for editorial writing," eighth grader Natalie Pritchett said. "In practice, we have been going over papers and fixing the mistakes and writing papers together so that we can make minimum errors."

The One-Act Play cast and crew will perform Mandy Conner's "Lafayette No.1" at the Lion Center on December 15. The play follows a group of orphans called the Forgotten during the yellow fever epidemic of 1816 in New Orleans. Our students will perform second of the four schools competing.

"I personally believe that the play will go well and that we should leave the building the first place medalists," eighth-grader Parker Haley said.

Junior High

Students must stay in the classroom for the duration of the exam time scheduled.

In order to exempt from exams, students must meet the designated criteria as of Dec. 9.

Students who do not attend their exam earn a zero.

Freshman/Sophomore Criteria

Students must have a semester average of 80 or above and 0 absences, a semester average of 85 or above and three or less absences, or a semester average of 90 or above with four or less absences.

Junior/Senior Criteria

Students must meet college readiness standards in addition to the freshman/sophomore criteria.

Absences Explained

The following absences do not count against students' exemptions: school-related absences, partial-day absences excused by a doctor's note, two medical days, two documented college days, two funeral days (for immediate family), and two court days.


