Dear School Community,

As the leaves begin to change and the air takes on a crisp, autumnal feel, it is my pleasure to welcome you to this edition of our newsletter. This month, we have many exciting updates and events to share with you.

A Season of Learning

October is a month of transition in many ways. Students have settled into their routines, and teachers are delving deeper into the curriculum. It's a time of growth and exploration, both academically and personally. We encourage parents and guardians to stay engaged in their child's education, ask questions, and participate in school activities whenever possible. Together, we can provide a nurturing environment for our students to thrive.

Proposal Number One—Statewide Ballot Constitutional Amendment on Repeal of Debt Ceiling for Small City School Districts

I would like to bring to your attention the upcoming Constitutional Amendment vote on November 7, 2023. The proposed amendment to Article 8, section 4 of the Constitution removes the special constitutional debt limitation now placed on small city school districts so that they will be treated the same as all other school districts.

This November 7, a **YES** vote will allow small city school districts to operate under the same debt limit as all other non-city school districts in New York State. Currently, small city districts are limited to a 5% debt ceiling rather than the 10% debt ceiling all other non-city school districts operate under law.

Many of New York's 57 small city school districts must break up needed construction and improvement projects into a series of small projects spread over many years to remain under their debt limit. A 10% debt limit will allow such projects of larger scope and scale to be completed sooner with better financial efficiency.

The small cities, such as Olean, were named in the NYS Constitution in 1951 as a way to give control and responsibility for their fiscal affairs. This 5% limit is the lowest included in the Constitution or in Statute and now, in 2023, does the opposite, limits a small city district's ability to control their fiscal affairs.

Voter approval of the proposed constitutional amendment would not give small city schools special treatment—it would allow them to have the same debt limit as their suburban and rural counterparts.

A YES vote will not raise your taxes.

This is a once-in-a-generation opportunity for impactful change for small city school districts such as Olean. Replacement of the 5% constitutional debt ceiling for small city school districts with a 10% statutory limit is essential to the continued integrity of our urban school infrastructure. Approval of this referendum will be a small but important step toward treating small city schools fairly and toward putting them on an equal footing with their peers serving suburban and rural communities. Failure to approve the referendum will impair the quality of small city programs and facilities to the great detriment of their students for many years to come. This referendum deserves your full and enthusiastic support.

Fall Extracurricular Activities

Our extracurricular programs are in full swing, offering students opportunities to explore their passions beyond the classroom. Whether it's sports, clubs, or creative arts, we encourage students to get involved and make the most of their school experience.

Celebrating Belonging in Our Schools

October is also National Bullying Prevention Month, which serves as a reminder of our commitment to fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all. We encourage parents, students, and staff to engage in conversations about belonging, respect, kindness, and acceptance. Together, we can create a school community that celebrates diversity and stands against bullying in all its forms.

School board members give the Olean City School District citizens a voice in education decision-making. Their contribution is a year-round commitment and we thank them for their dedicated service.




Readers + Leaders

Students in Mrs. Caya and Ms. Keis' class have been practicing how to use maps in a kickoff to our geography unit. After learning to use a compass to navigate our way, we planned a route







using Google Maps. We followed the route to find our way to the amazing new mural at War Vets Park where the artists were kind enough to take a break from their hard work to answer questions about time and funding of the mural, as well as the message behind it. We are so grateful for their willingness to brighten our day and our community!





Music at East View Elementary

Pre-K is exploring all of our first concepts in music: listening to directions, moving safely, and echo-singing. Pre-K music classes often reinforce what is being learned in the classroom as well so we are doing a lot of songs about colors. We have been using colorful scarves with movement and singing activities, as well as labeling colors in different books, like Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?

Kindergarten has been introduced to all the of the voices inside of us: sing, speak, whisper, shout and think! We have been practicing these each week with songs like "1,2,3,4, 5 – Once I Caught a Fish Alive" and "You've Got to Sing!" – ask your child to sing, speak, whisper, shout, or think one of these songs at home. We have also practiced the difference between moving safely in self-space and shared space. In chorus, we have practiced being "parrots" to help us echo-sing with songs like "Down by the Bay". We'll start prepping for our winter concert soon! (December 14th at 1:45pm at Eastview)

1st Grade has been reviewing and practicing steady beat. We can perform a steady beat in non-locomotor and locomotor space – ask your child to perform the "Apple Tree" song! We can also perform a steady beat on instruments as we practiced doing

this with our song "Welcome Back to School." In chorus, we have been reviewing our echo-singing, as well as practicing proper singing technique with our "head voice" – ask your child to sing the "Bluebird" song and demonstrate how to use a head voice on the highest part of the song. Our winter concert preparation will also begin soon! (December 15th at 1:45 pm at East View)

2nd and 3rd graders have reviewed beat versus rhythm. They can demonstrate the difference between both with the songs "Engine, Engine" (2nd) or "Obwisana". (3rd) We have also practiced journaling in our Listening Logs with our first song, the US national anthem. 3rd Graders are looking forward to starting recorders this year. 2nd and 3rd grade students will have their chorus concert in the spring.
