Achievement

This component represents whether student performance on state tests met established thresholds and how well students performed on tests overall.



Exceeds state standards in academic achievement

This component looks closely at the growth all students are making based on their past performances.



Significant evidence that the district exceeded student growth expectations.

Gap Closing

The Gap Closing Component is a measure of the reduction in educational gaps for student subgroups.

Significantly exceeds state standards in closing educational gaps

Graduation

The Graduation Component is a measure of the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate and the five-year adjusted cohort graduation rate.



Significantly exceeds state standards in graduation rates

Early Literacy

The Early Literacy Component is a measure of reading improvement and proficiency for students in kindergarten through third grade.



Significantly exceeds state standards in early literacy (K-3)

SAVE Students Erin's Law





SAVE Students Act

O.R.C. 3313.60

REQUIRES 1 hr OR 1 Standard Class Period per year programming in Social Inclusion, Violence Prevention, Suicide Prevention for grades 6-12.



Sandy Hook Promise

- > FREE
- No "set" curriculum

- > 1 video + 1 activity = requirement fulfilled
- Easy "lift" for staff /
 students



Erin's Law Requirements

O.R.C. 3313.60 & 3314.0310

- REQUIRES instruction in prevention of sexual abuse & dating/sexual violence for students and staff K-12.
- K-6: 1 hr focus on sexual abuse prevention annually
- > **7-12:** 1 hr focus on dating & sexual violence prevention during time frame

7-12 Instructional Model

COCA will provide 9th grade students instruction in prevention of dating & sexual violence during 9th grade health class.

Families can opt out of instruction.



K-6 Instructional Model

COCA will provide K-6 instruction in child sex abuse (K-3) and bullying (4-6) in March.

Families can opt out of instruction.



Staff Training

- COCA presentation to all staff at February Professional Learning Day.
- All staff completes Ohio School Safety Center training module.
- All staff review Mandated Reporter protocol via Abre Learning Module.

Student Wellness Updates



Second Step: K-6



- Developmentally-appropriate social-emotional programming.
- Counselors/Teachers incorporate Second Step lessons into school day on a weekly/monthly basis.

Catalyst Counseling



- Certified in-school counseling opportunities.
- Available to students at all RLSD buildings.
- Billed to insurance.

1N5 Partnership



- IN5 collaborates with school districts to reduce the stigma associated with mental health issues.
- RLSD has partnered with 1N5 for student, staff, and family wellness initiatives for three years.

Envision Partnerships LIFE IS WHAT YOU MAKE IT



Additional Wellness Opportunities

- Envision Partnerships: work with counselors to run small-group wellness sessions.
- Cincinnati Children's / PIRC: helps to coordinate support for students at risk.
- Weekly Campaigns: counselor-organized campaigns in each building. (i.e. Kindness Week)


Abre 360: Assessments

PROFILE ASSESSMENTS GRADES


