## **DISTRICT GOAL #1:**

Northern Highlands, in collaboration with the quad districts, will conduct a comprehensive curricular needs assessment designed to evaluate mathematics as well as health and physical education instruction and guide a critical review of curriculum, resources, and assessments. We will identify professional learning with K-12 representation from all schools and grade bands. Vertical articulation of common and effective practices will be a focus that will lead to updated units of study that reflect updated standards and instructional shifts in both areas of study.

#### The following represents the achievement of this goal:

- Facilitated quad articulation meetings in math as well as in health and PE throughout the school year that included K-12 teachers, instructional coaches, and department supervisors.
- Provided professional development in math that included:
  - Study of instructional practices and assessment design in math
  - Review placement practices for math courses
  - Conducted K-12 lesson study and instructional rounds to gather data on current practices
  - Gathered recommendations for
- Provided professional development health and physical education that included:
  - Dedicated PD pathway during professional development days
  - Shift instruction to a Sports Model
  - Conducted K-12 lesson study and instructional rounds to gather data on current practices

- Implemented goals from NJSCI survey (New Jersey School Climate Improvement) through Rutgers University to include more stakeholders and engagement
