

BOARD REPORT

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING May 10, 2021

The Brownwood ISD (BISD) Board of Trustees met for a regular session meeting on Monday, May 10, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. The session was called to order by Board President, Michael Cloy, who then gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

INSTRUCTIONAL FOCUS

BISD Deputy Superintendent, Ms. Liesa Land provided information regarding the summer learning program. After the time lost last year due to COVID, Brownwood ISD is offering a wider range of summer learning opportunities. For grades K-4, the program will offer a few hours a day of reading instruction for 3 weeks starting June 14 (M-Th). The program is not mandatory but will be offered first to those students who are shown to be struggling most (Tier 3). For grades K-6, online resources for summer learning will be offered for parents and students. Printed packets and reading materials will also be available to send home with students. In grades 7 and 8, as well as 9-12, online courses will be accessible for students who are in jeopardy of failing classes or for credit recovery (high school). Brownwood High School (BHS) students who have not yet passed required End-of-Course (EOC) tests, targeted instruction will be offered before the scheduled retesting June 22-29.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Young provided brief updates on the following topics:

- BISD was one of the districts selected to send trustees to the in-person Summer Leadership Institute in Fort Worth on June 23-26.
- In addition to the Student Advisory Cabinet, Dr. Young has met with the Parent Advisory and Teacher Advisory groups. Dr. Young thanked them for their continued input and feedback.
- Additional COVID relief stimulus money has been released by the governor to be dispersed over the next few years. Discussions have begun gathering input for possible uses which may include allocations for HVAC systems replacement and reconditioning as well as filling in instructional gaps left as a result of COVID.
- Possible adjustments to school times could be finalized soon. Administrators have been
 working for several months for a solution that will align campuses with the same
 number of minutes.
- BISD and Brownwood Education Foundation (BEF) have partnered to reduce the number of school supplies required for parents to purchase for the 2021-2022 school year. As it stands, the list would only require parents to purchase a pencil box, backpack, and water bottle. All other supplies would be provided.
- A billboard campaign featuring an Alumni Spotlight and other BISD highlights will be rolled out over the summer. The Alumni Spotlight will feature graduates of BISD who have celebrated success in life after high school. In addition, our Back to School ROAR magazine will also feature an Alumni Spotlight article. - Dr. Young provided a staffing report detailing resignations and new hires within the district. Will Parker was introduced as the new Head Boys' Basketball Coach. Coach Parker, his wife Leah, and their children were also in attendance (pictured below). Leah Parker will also be working with BISD as a Mental Health Specialist.



DISCUSSION & ACTION ITEMS

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

Special Populations: Dr. Young provided a summary of the report provided by BISD Special Populations Director, Darla Peter. The number of students currently within Special Populations categories include 438 under Special Education, 335 under Section 504, and 150 in the Dyslexia Program. Additional program highlights included:

- BISD was awarded two competitive grants, totaling the amount of \$65,000.00. The grant money was utilized to provide a part-time Speech and Language Pathologist and a part-time Licensed Specialist in School Psychology for the 2020-2021 school year. In addition, BISD was awarded a Mental Health Teletherapy Grant totaling \$18,600.00.
- BISD is looking into becoming a Unified Special Olympics District.
- Completed the Texas Education Agency's (TEA) 6-year Special Education Cyclical Audit of special education and the TEA's On-Site special education audit.
- Continued implementation of the Adaptive PE Program with Howard Payne at Coggin Intermediate School and expanded the program to the middle school and high school.
- Moving forward with Community-Based Instruction Program Goals focusing on independent living skills and vocational skills, while emphasizing communication and social skills in and outside the community. Vocational skills, adaptive living skills, and community-based job skills will be emphasized throughout the curriculum.

Dr. Young praised Ms. Peter's work and noted how blessed Brownwood ISD and its students are to have her heading up the Special Populations program.

DISCUSSION OF DISTRICT OF INNOVATION (DOI) RENEWAL

In February of 2017, the Board approved BISD's DOI plan covering school start date and CTE teacher certification. This plan expires in February of 2022. The district has successfully utilized the DOI status which has helped secure CTE teachers and allowed for flexibility in the school calendar. A renewal plan was provided for review along with a committee, timeline, and target approval date of September 2021.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF DISTRICT AUDITOR FOR 2021-2022

Brownwood ISD requested qualifications from public accounting firms and/or individuals to perform the annual audit for fiscal year 2021. Trustee Thompson moved to approve Pattillo, Brown & Hill as the district auditor/accounting firm for the annual audit for fiscal year 2021, with the opportunity to extend this agreement for another four years. Trustee Evans seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
