



Sevenstar / Dual Enrollment

Aletheia high school students (grades 9-12) have the option of taking on-line courses through Sevenstar Academy. Sevenstar is a ministry of ACSI and is an excellent way to take Advanced Placement courses.

Aletheia allows our students to take Sevenstar classes for the following reasons:

- to provide them with greater access to Advanced Placement (AP) classes,
- to provide additional course options where the school feels it is appropriate,
- to allow students who enter Aletheia after the ninth grade and are out of sequence with our class schedule to make up the needed classes.

Below are listed the guidelines for taking a Sevenstar class at Aletheia:

- Students cannot take a Sevenstar class in place of the same class that we teach at Aletheia. (e.g. a student cannot take Algebra I through Sevenstar since we teach Algebra I)
- Students will take P.E. classes at ACA unless there is a physical limitation that leaves the student unable to participate in a class.
- Students can take an AP class as a substitute for a class taught at ACA.
- To fulfill the Florida state requirement on a fine arts credit, students have two options: Drama (1/2 credit) AND Speech (1/2 credit) or AP Art History (1credit).
- At this time, foreign languages other than Spanish will be taken through Sevenstar. Students can choose to take a foreign language class over the summer. Students are required to have two years of a foreign language to graduate from ACA. Options include:
 - Chinese
 - French
 - Latin
 - Spanish (in-house)
 - Sign Language
 - German
 - Chinese

Aletheia will cover the cost for a student to take one Sevenstar course in addition to their foreign language/AP classes per school year. Additional classes will be at the expense of the financially responsible guardian.

Below is the procedure to enroll in a Sevenstar class.

1. Visit the Sevenstar website and talk to the Aletheia guidance counselor if you are interested in taking a Sevenstar class
2. The guidance counselor will enroll your student in a Sevenstar class.

When a student is enrolled in a Sevenstar class their progress is monitored and controlled by the Sevenstar instructor. However, it is the school's desire that a student's progress closely follows the Aletheia school calendar; therefore, the student should finish the first semester's work by the end of Aletheia's first semester. Students who chronically fail to meet Sevenstar progress requirements may not be approved by Aletheia to take other Sevenstar classes in the future.

Seniors taking a Sevenstar class as a graduation requirement will need to finish the class (both semesters) before they will be allowed to leave during their designated Sevenstar class period, either arriving late or leaving early, as the class schedule allows. Seniors taking an AP Sevenstar course as a graduation requirement cannot complete the full course in the first semester, so their eligibility to have a flex-schedule will be measured against their progress chart. These students must attend full days of school in any week that they are not on pace with the course progress chart.

For a student to be eligible to play on an Aletheia athletic team, they must meet the same grade criteria as that required for a regular Aletheia class and the following progress criteria. For a one credit Sevenstar course:

1. Segment one must be 50% complete by the end of the 1st grading period.
2. Segment one must be 100% complete by the end of the 1st semester.
3. Segment two must be 50% complete by the end of the 3rd grading period.
4. Segment two must be 100% complete by the end of the 2nd semester.

Sevenstar students are ineligible to play until they meet the above progress criteria. Additionally, the following progress requirements must be met for a Sevenstar student to be considered for the following awards and scholarships.



1. For a Sevenstar student taking a one credit course to qualify for Honor Roll or the Highest GPA Award, segment one must be completed by the end of the first semester.
2. For a Sevenstar student taking a one credit course to graduate from high school or to be eligible for the Bright Futures and Byrd scholarships or to be considered for Valedictorian or Salutatorian, the student must have completed segment one and two and have their grade available by the first day of senior finals.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Enrollment is an accelerated program that allows high school students to simultaneously earn credit toward high school completion and a career certificate, or an associate or baccalaureate degree at a Florida public institution. Any student interested in taking a Dual Enrollment class should contact the school's guidance counselor.

Since the goal of Aletheia is to educate our students with a biblical worldview, ACA permits its students to participate in Dual Enrollment classes through UWF and PSC on a limited basis. Students may dual-enroll in the entire catalog of classes through Cedarville University or CampusEDU. This ensures that the core classes a student takes are taught from a biblical perspective while allowing a student to take classes that are not offered at Aletheia. Credits for Dual Enrollment classes will be given according to the guidelines from the State of Florida Department of Education.

Dual Enrollment classes will receive an additional 1.0 points added to a student's GPA.
