The Hewlett-Woodmere School District, founded in 1898, is a diverse residential community located on the South Shore of Long Island, approximately 25 miles from midtown Manhattan. The ethnicity of the District is comprised of 60% White, 9% Asian or Pacific Islanders, 19% Hispanic, 10% Black, 1% American Indian or Alaskan Native, and 1% multicultural. Hewlett-Woodmere has a population of 20,000 residents, composed predominantely of business and professional people. SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Research Programs — Science and Social Science — In these programs, students conduct independent original research in science and social sciences under the direction of teacher-mentors. Projects culminate with entry into numerous prestigious competitions, including the International Science and Engineering Fair; Siemens Competition in Math, Science and Technology; and the Regeneron Science Talent Search. Students are trained in all aspects of research and are expected to make presentations of their work in a seminar format. Students must complete a rigorous interdisciplinary research course prior to entering the program. The Science Research Program has achieved national recognition. The Independent Science Research Program is conducted in an on-site research laboratory.

Virtual Enterprise — Focused on 21st century skills, the course is a two-credit course that provides students the opportunity to manage a business. The students create a business plan and implement it by selling virtual products to the other 3,000 International Virtual Enterprises. Participation in this course fulfills the economics requirements for graduation.

AP Capstone — An innovative diploma program that provides students with an opportunity to engage in rigorous scholarly practice of the core academic skills necessary for successful college completion. AP Capstone is built on the foundation of two courses — **AP Seminar** and **AP Research** — and is designed to complement and enhance the in-depth, discipline-specific study provided through AP courses. This program offers students a unique opportunity to distinguish themselves to colleges and universities.

Silver Cord Recognition — The Silver Cord, worn by students at commencement, honors graduates who have performed community service for 35 hours or more. The Class of 2023 honored 119 students with Silver Cord recognition.

Co-curricular Activities — Hewlett High School offers students the opportunity to participate in more than 44 co-curricular clubs and activities. In addition to the co-curricular clubs, HHS offers membership into the ten following honor societies: Art, Business and Marketing, Computer Science, Foreign Language, Math, National, Quill and Scroll, Science, Thespian, and Tri-M. Students are invited to join after meeting specific requirements.



Art Study — Hewlett-High School's Art Department has had student work featured in local museums such as the Nassau County Art Museum, Stony Brook



Museum, Long Island Museum, and Art League of Ll. Students have participated in New York State art exhibitions such as the New York State Board Association, Capital Building, Advanced Visions AP Gallery, NYSATA, and various others. In the 2022–2023 school year, students received numerous art awards, as well as Honorable Mention in the Advanced Vision Art Exhibition.

Music Study – Hewlett High School's Music Department has been honored to receive the National Association of Music Educators award for Best Communities of Music Education. The department features mixed grade level ensembles, as well as honors level Band, Choir, and Orchestra. More than 60% of the student body participates in music ensembles. The High School Musical Club consistently performs yearly high-level Broadway shows. Students have performed at Carnegie Hall, Disney, Boston, Montreal, and Puerto Rico. During the 2022-2023 school year, 163 high school students participated in NYSSMA and 41 students auditioned for NYSSMA All State. Six students were selected to participate in New York All State Festival. Three students were selected into All-Eastern, and one student was selected for the All National Ensemble. More than 45 students were selected to participate in All-County ensembles. Our honor ensembles have earned Gold and Gold with Distinction adjudication rating at levels 5 and 6 at NYSSMA Majors.

Theater Program — The Theater Program at Hewlett High School is part of the English Department and includes four elective classes: Introduction to Theater, Theater Workshop 1/2, College Theater Workshop 3/4, and College Theater Workshop 5/6. In these classes, which run sequentially, students are exposed to a variety of challenging topics such as improvisation, modern scene study, movement and voice, acting on camera, directing, musical theater, theater history, and Shakespearean acting. In College Modern Drama, which is offered as either a senior English credit or an elective credit, students study the evolution and major movements of modern drama. In addition, the Hewlett Theater Company produces two full-length theater productions each year, the annual Senior Theater Project One-Acts, and the annual Middle School Theater Workshops and Day of Theater class showcases.

Athletics — Hewlett High School is the home of the Bulldogs. We offer 52 boys and girls junior varsity and varsity teams at the high school level. Our interscholastic athletic teams foster excellence through the educational and competitive experience while upholding an atmosphere of sportsmanship. Many of our athletic teams are recognized by the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) as Scholar Athlete Teams.

Dual Credit College Course Enrollment — Hewlett High School offers college credit to students who take courses through its partnership with SUNY Albany, Syracuse University, LIU Post, Molloy College, and Adelphi University.
