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- TITLE 1 is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- The goal of TITLE 1 to help schools provide a high quality education for every child by providing extra help to students who need it most. These students are those who are the furthest away from meeting the standards the state has set for all children.
- The Federal Government provides funding to states who in turn send the money to school districts based on the numbers of low income families.
- Local school districts work to identify students most in need, set goals, for improvement, measure student progress, develop programs that add to regular classroom instruction, and involve parents in all aspects of the program.
- The benefits generally offered by TITLE 1 programs are smaller classes, additional teachers and paraprofessionals, additional training to staff, extra time for instruction, a variety of teaching practices and materials, and career and college awareness.
- South Point Local Schools operates a School wide TITLE 1 Program in both elementary buildings. Schools with 40% or more of children from low income families can develop school wide TITLE1 programs to serve all students. School wide programs can combine TITLE 1 funds with federal, state, and local funds to improve school programs.
- Parent involvement is critical to a quality TITLE 1 program. Parent involvement can boost your child's achievement.
