# Burbank High Athletic Hall of Fame 2010

1. **Byron “Tony” Frank** “28” During his high school career, Tony was considered the best athlete of his time maybe even the best athlete ever at Burbank High. He earned 16 varsity letters and led his team to numerous league championships. After high school Tony played football at UCLA

2. **Roy Lockwood** “32” Roy was a stand-out athlete in three sports for Burbank High. He came back to coach at his alma mater where he led the basketball and swim teams to numerous league championships and a C.I.F championship in swim in 1967. Roy was also a champion badminton player. Roy went onto the University of Redlands where he played in three sports and is in their athletic Hall of Fame.
3. **John Lockwood** “60” John was a standout football player for Burbank High. In his senior year he was an all CIF back, Foothill League Back of the year and was a standout sprinter on the track team. Like his father, John came back to Burbank High to coach the varsity football team. John went to play Football at University of Colorado and finished at USC.
4. **Bob Pierce** “59” Bob was a great runner for Burbank High. He ran three years of varsity cross country and track. It was on the track that he gained his fame. In his senior year he was the California state high hurdle champion. He was the first of three track athletes to be a state champion. After high school he went onto USC to run track.
5. **Ken Ziskin** “66” You could always be found Ken in the pool. He was a stand out in water polo and swim. He won many league championships both as an individual and as a member of the team. In swim he was a two time CIF champion in the 100 meter breast stroke and three time All American. After high school he continued his swimming career at USC.
6. **Ralph Botting** “74” Ralph was a standout pitcher on our baseball team. During his senior year he was named the C.I.F. player of the year. He led the baseball team to the semifinals in the playoffs. He has many more accolades in baseball, including being drafted by the Angels right out of high school.
7. **Dr. Christy Calderon** “87” Christi is considered one of the best female athletes to attend Burbank High. She excelled in whatever she did. During her career at Burbank High, Christi was all C.I.F. in two sports. She is still in the record books in basketball and softball. After graduation Christi went on to play softball at the University of California at Berkeley, where she is still in the top ten of many softball categories.
8. **Frank Kallem** and **Dave Kemp**. Even though they are not Burbank High graduates, their names are synonymous with Burbank athletics. They have accounted for numerous league championships and have had great coaching success at the highest level of high school sports. Frank’s coaching tenure at Burbank High started in the fall of 1962 and ended in the spring of 2000. Dave’s coaching tenure began in the spring semester of 1966 and ended in the spring of 2000.

This year we honor two of our C.I.F championship teams. Both are special in their own ways. First is the 1975 girls’ softball team. Not only because they have won our only girls’ C.I.F. championship. They were the pioneers of female sports in the City of Burbank. Without them our sports at both schools would not be at the level that they are today. The second team that we honor is the 1964 boys’ cross country team. They laid the foundation of what became a running dynasty in the City of Burbank and C.I.F. They dominated their opponents. In the championship race they placed 5 runners in the top twenty. They were led by Freddy Ortega and Joe Santa Cruz.
