On November 11, 1919 president Wilson issued a message to his people how he felt about this day and announced it as the first “Armistice Day.”

On June 4, 1926 the United States Congress adopted a resolution, requesting that president Calvin Coolidge for proclamations calling for the observance of November 11 with ceremonies.

On May 13, 1938 in the United States November 11th became a legal national holiday

Veterans Day is a federal holiday that honors military veterans, who have served in the United States Armed Forces.

All schools and government offices are closed on Veterans Day

About 1.6 million veterans are women.

NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH



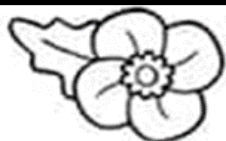
