


APRIL 10 - NATIONAL SIB-LINGS DAY

One excellent way to practice English and increase your vocabulary is by reading and writing, and a good choice is poetry because sometimes the author uses figurative language to give color to their script. One type of poetry is the Haiku, which emerged from Japanese literature during the 17th Century. It is composed with 17 syllables arranged in three lines of 5, 7, and 5 syllables respectively.

Haikus were used to express experiences (or insights) from natural phenomena, but nowadays it is a poem with 17 syllables that expresses emotional states. Traditional haiku poets are Matsuo Bashō, Yosa Buson, and Kobayashi Issa. In the English-speaking world, this kind of poetry was popularized by Imagists, Ezra Pound and Allen Ginsberg.

The idea of the grilled cheese is as old as cheese, bread and flame.


During the industrial revolution, Otto Frederick Rohwedder invented the bread slicer and James L. Kraft created processed cheese. This cheese was considered to be a cheap

Originally, these sandwiches were made with cheese that was grated. Sliced cheese was not introduced until the late 1940s when Kraft Foods introduced Kraft singles and then, years later in the 1960s, supermarkets began to stock cheese slices.




World Penguin Day recognizes one of the most unique birds on the planet. These animals are the most beautiful.


There are 17 species of penguins and all their natural habitats are in the southern hemisphere.

The Eiffel Tower is one of the wonders of the world. Located in Paris, France, it was built with wooden scaffolds ad small hoists directly fixed to the tower. It took just two years, two months, and five days to build the Eiffel Tower. Construction began in January 1887 and was finished on March 31, 1889.

The Eiffel Tower is made of iron, not steel. The puddle iron that makes up the Eiffel Tower's structure came from Pompey forges, east of France. The iron plates and beams produced through the puddling process were then preassembled in the Eiffel factories in Levallois using rivets.

EASTER DAY IN The UKRAINE

Easter is the feast of Christ's resurrection, which in its observance combines both pagan and Christian elements. Easter (in Ukrainian: 'Velykden' or 'Paskha' (is preceded by seven weeks of Lent and celebrated on each first week after vernal equinox and full moon. It is the most cheerful holiday for orthodox believers



Easter cake ('Kulich' (and painted eggs ('Krashanki' (are the symbols of Ukrainian Easter and obligatory food on the table this day. Kulich is baked from yeast dough in the form of cylinder. Krashanka is a boiled and painted egg. On this Day Ukrainian kids play their favorite Easter game: knocking the eggs. If you knock somebody's egg and your egg is not broken, then you are the winner.



The krashanky and pysanky (Easter eggs) are an old pre-Christian element and have an important role in the Easter rites. On this day they are given as gifts or exchanged. There is also the rite of sprinkling with water, which is still carried on in Western Ukraine on the next day afrer Easter (Wet Monday, Oblyvanyi ponedilok). It is practiced by young people, the boys usually splashing the girls with water.



During the Easter season in Ukraine the cult of the dead is observed. The dead are remembered during the whole week after Easter, especially on the first Sunday following Easter Sunday. People gather in the cemeteries, bringing with them a dish containing some food and wine, which they consume, leaving the rest at the grave site.
