The **International Women's Day** date was moved to March 8 in 1913.

The **day** aimed to help nations worldwide eliminate discrimination against **women**. It also focused on helping **women** gain full and equal participation in global development. **International Men's Day** is also **celebrated** on November 19 each year.

Purple is the internationally recognized **color** to symbolize **women** while the combination of the **colors** green, purple and white is meant to represent **women's** equality, according to the IWD website. Purple, or the combination of those **colors**, may be displayed to celebrate **International Women's Day**.

The United Nations **began** celebrating International **Women's Day** in the International **Women's** Year, 1975. In 1977, the United Nations General Assembly invited member states to proclaim March 8 as the UN **Day** for **women's** rights and world peace.

## OUR FIELD TRIP TO CALIFORNIA SCIENCE CENTER

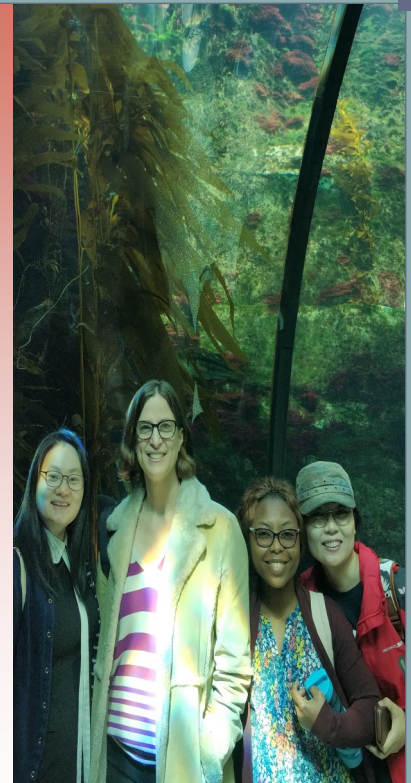
