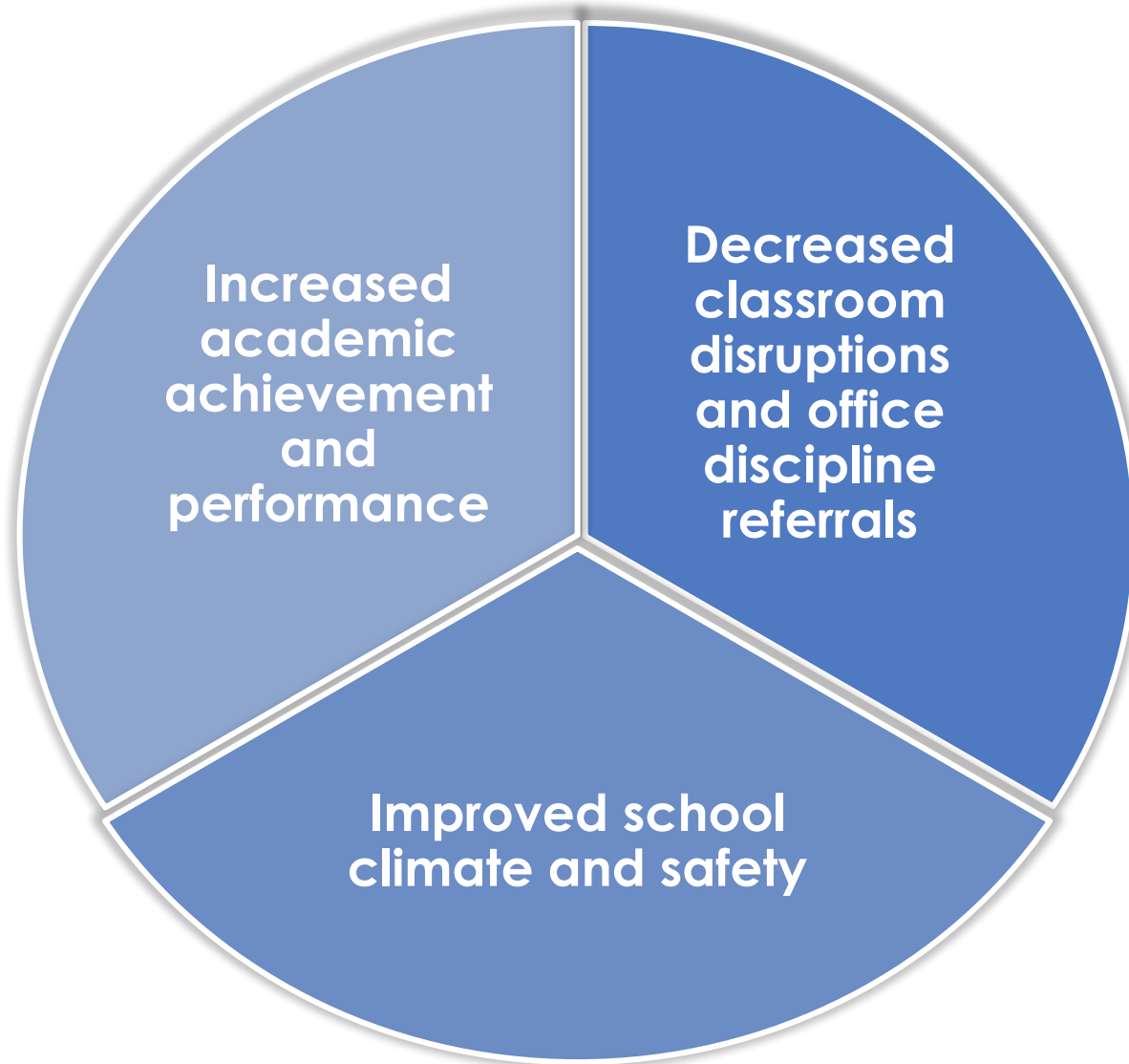


Purpose of PBIS

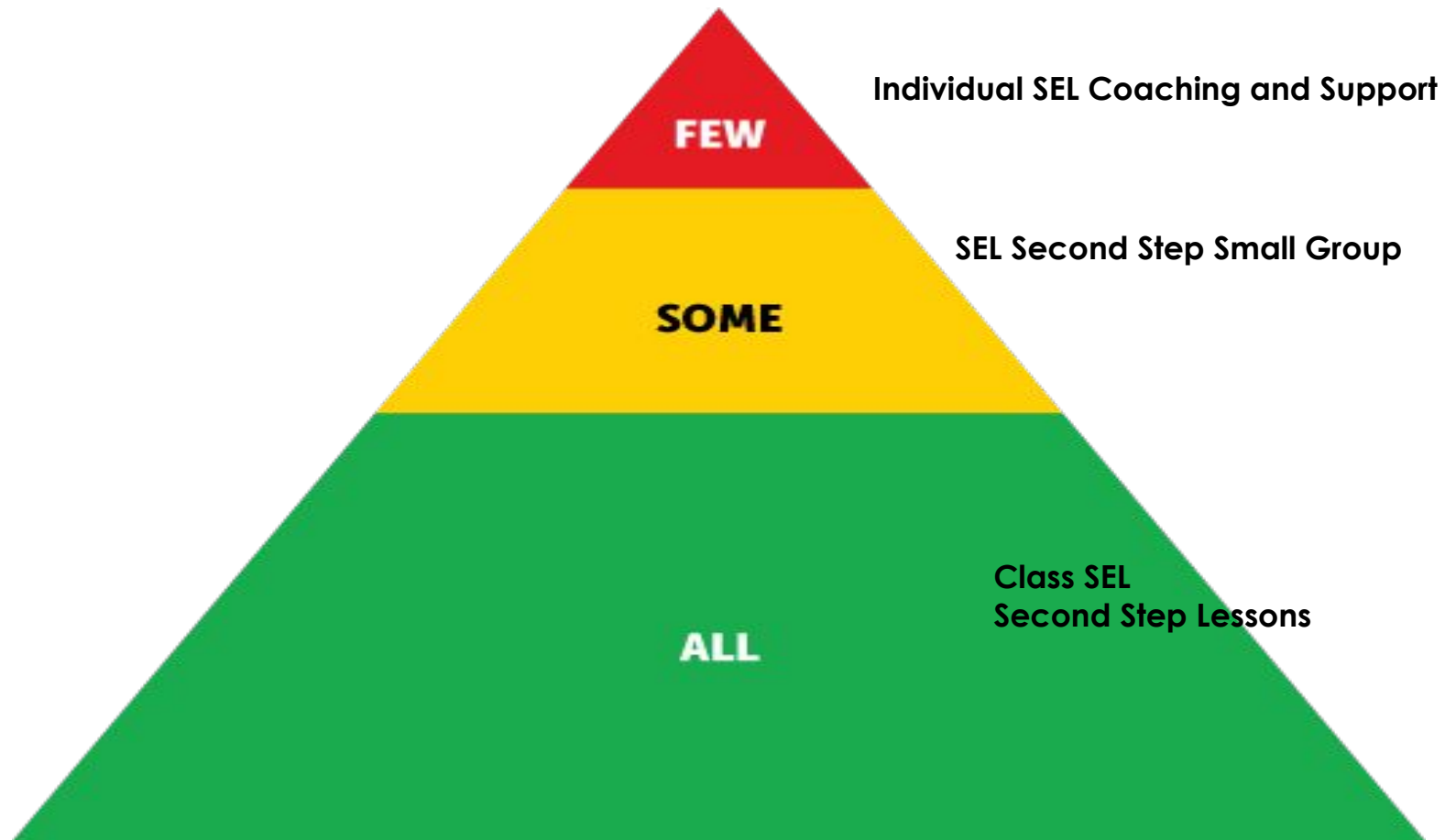


General Research

PBIS implementation affects valued educational outcomes. Findings demonstrate that PBIS can be designated an evidence-based practice for reducing exclusionary discipline and improving *social, emotional, and behavioral* outcomes.
