

by California Department of Social Services (CDSS)

California Department of Social Services provides temporary cash assistance to meet basic family needs. It also provides education, employment, and training programs to assist the family's move toward self-sufficiency.

Cash Assistance

California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs)



The California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) provides temporary financial assistance and employment-focused services to families with minor children who have income and property below State maximum limits for their family size. CalWORKs is a time-limited program that helps to pay for housing, food, utilities, clothing, and other necessary expenses.

Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI)



Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI) provides cash to certain aged, blind, and disabled legal non-citizens ineligible to supplemental Security Income/State Supplemental Payment due to their immigration status. CAPI participants may be eligible for Medi-Cal, In-Home Supportive Services and/or Food Stamp benefits.

General Relief (GR)



General Relief (GR) is a County-funded program that supplies cash aid to indigent adults, and children in certain unusual circumstances who are ineligible for Federal or State programs. Able-bodied adults can receive aid for no more than nine months in any 12-month period. Participation in the GR employment and training program, General Relief Opportunities for Work (GROW), is mandatory for able-bodied adults.

Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA)



The Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA) program provides cash assistance, Medi-Cal, and Cal Fresh to refugees for eight months starting with the month in which the person was admitted into the U.S. as a refugee. Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI) supplies cash assistance to certain aged, blind, and disabled legal non-citizens ineligible to Supplemental Security Income/ Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA) or the date asylum was granted, or from the date of application for aid (for trafficking and crime victims). Refugees who are receiving CaIWORKs or SSI/SSP cannot receive RCA.

The Housing Choice Voucher Program (HCV), also known as Section 8, is the federal government's major program for assisting very low-income families, the elderly, and the disabled to afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private market.

A housing subsidy is paid to the landlord directly by the Public Housing Agency (PHA) on behalf of the participating family. The family then pays the difference between the actual rent charged by the landlord and the amount subsidized by the program.

Burbank Public Libraries are locations where community members from all walks of life come to find information and get connected to services. While traditional Library staff are well-trained in research skills to provide that information.

Burbank Public Library's social worker joined the staff in July 2021. Sona Ter-Yegishyan is co-located at Burbank's three libraries and two senior centers, in a position jointly funded by the Library and the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department of the City of Burbank. Sona brings an important level of expertise to these settings, allowing for improved services to those in need. She is available to meet one-on-one with individuals of all ages and families in order to understand their needs and connect them to services. To this end, she also works to expand the Library's partnerships with local and regional nonprofits and government agencies who provide services including shelter, food, mental and physical health care, financial and legal assistance, transportation and more. Services are available to people experiencing homelessness but also anyone who needs assistance.

Burbank Public Library's social services connections work hand-in-hand with other Library services aimed at helping people improve their education, skills and life prospects.
