

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Out of all his options for a project he decided to remember our program where he and his family made many friends and wonderful memories.



HELEN von SEGGERN DECEMBER 12, 1913 – JANUARY 7, 2021

Helen von Seggern was the matriarch of our Parent Education Program. Helen just passed away on January 7. She lived to the amazing age of 107. She was a life long learner, always learning and growing herself. She surprised people with how much she maintained her curious and open mind. What a great example for everyone to follow.

She was interested in all things family and community. I took over for Helen when she retired and promised her that I would look after "her baby," our parent ed program. Now the torch has passed to Chris Tutak. The goals of this program have remained the same throughout the years. We are here to help parents reach their goals of parenting the best they can as per Helen's example.

Helen started this program at the Burbank Adult School over 55 years ago. She had the vision to look at parenting as an important skill for society. When she began this program it started small with 1 or 2 classes. She grew it to a program with about 25 classes. During that time her core vision remained the same. This was to help parents be the best parents that they can be for their children. This gave parents the chance to be the parents they always wished they had.

Helen took us from being scattered at several locations at different elementary schools in Burbank to our "home" at the Burbank Adult School site. With planning and staffing our classes became a great source for the community. Helen's vision of the importance of parenting well has continued through our classes over the years. If we are to include this pandemic year we even went virtual. The outreach to help parents and families thrive continues.

Helen was a small but mighty person with big shoes for us to fill. Helen was very diplomatic with some parents. Always calming down the worries of new parents. Helen has been teacher, mentor, diplomat, mother hen, nurse and all around professional. In celebration of Helen, the auditorium at the Adult School is named the Helen von Seggren Auditorium. She was the first woman to have a school building in Burbank named after a woman. This is very fitting. We are all so proud of that recognition for Helen.

As the leader of our staff, she guided us through rough times and good times with a sense of optimism. We all love and appreciate the work she has done on behalf of families in Burbank. We all laughed a lot and learned a lot under her tutelage. She has enriched and changed countless lives. I have always said that when I grow up I want to be just like Helen. During my daily job when problems came up, many times I asked myself "What would Helen say now? What would Helen do?" That kept me out of trouble. Helen will always be a huge presence at school. I know that Chris is following in her footsteps to continue Helen's legacy.

Finally I feel like we should all be singing "Wheels on the Bus" in memory of Helen. And Cheers once more to the Wonderful Helen!

You **MUST** email Chris Tutak, Christutak@burbankusd.org, to say you will be having pictures taken. We need to have enough people to make it worthwhile for the photography company. Also Chris will be setting up blocks of time for people to arrive so please RSVP.

Payment is by **check** or **cash** ONLY. An envelope will be provided on the day of for you to fill out with your information and payment, which you will hand to the photographer. Please also bring a **pen**.

Masks are required for everyone over 2 years old once inside the school gate. School age children are welcome.

You may bring props from home, (i.e., stuffed animal, wagon, etc.). Also, bring your own hair brush as the photographer will not be providing one.

The photo session will be set up on the outside walkway by room 701 (3-year-old discussion room). You will drive to the back part of the parking lot to the last gate. One family at a time will wait on an outside bench in the walkway. When the bench is vacated, the next family, honor system, will take the bench. Children must stay with their parent. Stay in your car until it is your turn. An aide will help facilitate this process. Thank you.


