This is to inform you that Lakewood High School meets both the Washington State HIV/AIDS Prevention Education Requirements and the Sexual Health Education (Healthy Youth Act) Requirements. The HIV/AIDS Prevention Education Requirements state,

“At least one month before teaching HIV/AIDS prevention education in any classroom, each district must notify parents and guardians that instruction will take place.” (pg. 108)

Lakewood High School Health teachers will introduce the curriculum in the Fall semester during January 2022 and in the Spring semester in June 2022.


