Magnet High School Academic Honesty Policy

Definition of Academic Dishonesty

Pupils are expected to be honest in all of their academic work – they will not engage in any of the following acts:

- 1. Cheating on Examinations, including but not limited to:
 - a. The non-authorized use of books, notes, and/or cheat sheets
 - b. Copying from other pupils' papers
 - c. Exchanging information with other pupils orally, in writing, electronically, and/or by signals
 - d. Obtaining copies of the examination illegally
 - e. Other similar activities
- 2. Facilitating Academic Dishonesty by:
 - a. Offering one's work/homework to be copied
 - b. Sharing exam contents and/or answers orally, in writing, and/or electronically with someone who has not taken it
- 3. <u>Plagiarism</u> is not permitted in term papers, themes, essays, reports, images, take-home examinations, and other academic work. Plagiarism is defined as:
 - a. Stealing or use without acknowledgment of the ideas, words, formulas, textual materials, online services, computer programs, etc. from another source
 - b. In any way presenting work that is not one's own (this includes copying another pupil's homework)
- 4. **Falsifications**, including but not limited to:
 - a. Forging signatures
 - b. Altering answers or inserting answers after they have been graded
 - c. The erasure of grader's markings
 - d. Other acts that allow for falsely taking credit

Procedures for Incidents of Academic Dishonesty

A teacher who believes that a pupil has been academically dishonest in his/her class will resolve the matter in the following manner:

1. Discuss the Incident with the Pupil

If you need assistance dealing with the situation, contact an administrator for support.

2. <u>Contact the Parent/Guardian</u>

3. Take Disciplinary Action

The teacher is authorized to reprimand the pupil orally and/or in writing. The teacher is also authorized to withhold credit in the work tainted by the academic dishonesty.

4. <u>Report the Incident to an Administrator</u> – *all violations of the Honor Code must be documented* Use the school defined documentation procedures.

The Principal will determine if further discipline of the pupil is appropriate and will determine the nature of the discipline on a case-by-case basis. The Principal will report all violations of the Honor Code to the National Honor Society advisor.

A pupil who has violated the honor code will be subjected to a range of penalties including, but not limited to:

- Loss of credit for the work
- Suspension from co-curricular activities and/or leadership roles
- Ineligibility for or dismissal from Honor Society organizations
- Ineligibility for graduation awards and school sponsored scholarships
