General Municipal Election Day November 5, 2024

Menifee voters will elect City Council representatives for the Mayor, District 1 and District 3. Each representative will serve for a full, four-year term ending in December 2028. To be eligible to run for City Council, residents must be a registered voter and live within the district they are applying for; meanwhile the mayor is elected at-large and may live within any district. 

Passed by 68% of Menifee voters in 2016, Menifee's Quality of Life Measure is a 1% sales tax that helps provide funding for critical services like police and fire, as well as major infrastructure projects. HOLLAND ROAD OVERPASS PROJECT UPDATES

The Holland Road Overpass Project, partially funded by the Quality of Life Measure, is continuing to make great progress and recently achieved a major milestone. On March 12, nearly 110 concrete trucks traveled to the construction site to pour 1,100 cubic yards of concrete! That's equivalent to three football fields!

The Holland Road Overpass is a vital Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project that will provide a new east-west corridor through Menifee and will help alleviate traffic on Newport Road and Scott Road. CITY OF MENIFEE SECURES OVER \$40 MILLION IN GRANT FUNDING

City staff actively identifies and applies for grant opportunities from regional, state, and federal programs to fund projects within the Capital Improvement Program (CIP). Grants are used to leverage local funds, such as the Quality of Life Measure, and complete the necessary funding for the design, environmental, and/or construction phases of projects. The City of Menifee has been successful in receiving confirmation of awards for funding through multiple grant programs, as shown below.

MENIFEE WASTE MANAGE

COOL YOUR COALS!

Just as those coals helped to get your fire pit or backyard BBQ going, they can quickly start a fire in your trash cart, the back of a collection truck or at a waste facility. Properly dispose of hot coals and ashes:

- Hot coals and ashes stay hot for several days. Let them cool for more than 48 hours before disposal.
- Place hot coals and ashes in a metal container and cover them with water to fully extinguish them (Do not use a plastic, paper, wood or galvanized container).
- Do not place other combustibles in the container with the coals or ashes.

HIDDEN HOUSEHOLD HAZARDS

Many everyday household items, such as batteries, disinfectants, and cleaners can cause a fire in your trash cart or in your neighborhood when they come in contact with other materials or get compacted inside a collection truck.

To help protect your family and community, keep these items out of your cart:

- · Batteries of any kind
- Compressed gas cylinders
- Flammable and combustible liquids
- Garden and pool chemicals •
- Household disinfectants and chemicals
- Motor oil and oil rags
- Paint and paint-related products
- Unknown substances
 - Vehicle fluids

Please remember that California SB 1383 requires all homes and businesses to separate organic materials (food scraps, paper, landscape) from the trash bin. This customer guide also details state-required periodic compliance monitoring of organics carts via smart truck technology. To avoid contamination fees, please ensure proper sorting of waste.



EVERY JULY. the City of Menifee celebrates "PARKS MAKE LIFE BETTER MONTH" to raise awareness of the benefits of parks and recreation in our community. The City of Menifee has 46 parks over 50-square miles offering a wide variety of outdoor activities from pickleball and basketball courts, to playgrounds and tot lots, to exercise equipment and walking paths. Learn-To-Swim Program

The City of Menifee's Learn-To-Swim program offers lessons for all swimming abilities. Lessons are offered in two-week sessions.

Each class is conducted under the supervision of certified Water Safety Instructors. Using the American Red Cross curriculum and training, Learn-To-Swim classes are separated into different proficiency levels that help your child learn and progress at a comfortable pace. With a ratio of one instructor per six students, the program focuses on building skills one step at a time.

Level Descriptions

Level 1: Water Exploration – Ages 4-17

No Skill Prerequisites Required for Level 1.

This level is designed for a child's first exposure to water without their parent, to orient young children to the aquatic environment, and help them gain basic water safety skills. In addition, participants develop positive attitudes and safe practices in and around the water.

Level 2: Primary Skills – Ages 4-17

Skill Prerequisites: Must be independently comfortable in the water.

This level is designed to give participants success with fundamental skills and marks the beginning of independent locomotive skills. Participants learn to glide and float without assistance and further develop simultaneous and alternating arm and leg actions on front and back, laying the foundation for future strokes. New water safety topics are introduced and previous skills reinforced.

To Pass This Level: Must be able to swim five-yards front crawl and backstroke, unassisted.

Level 3: Stroke Development – Ages 4-17

Skill Prerequisites: Must be able to swim five-yards front crawl and backstroke, unassisted.

This level is designed to expand proficiency of previously learned skills by providing additional guided practice. Participants learn to swim front crawl and backstroke at rudimentary proficient levels, as well as introducing scissor kick, dolphin kick, and elementary backstroke.

To Pass This Level: Must be able to swim 10-yards front crawl and backstroke, unassisted.



Level Descriptions (cont.)

Level 4: Stroke Improvement - Ages 4-17

Skill Prerequisites: Must be able to swim 10-yards front crawl and backstroke, unassisted.

This level is designed for participants to improve their previously developed aquatic skills by increasing their endurance and swimming greater distances with more advanced proficiency. Participants add arm actions to perform rudimentary sidestroke, butterfly, breaststroke, and treading water.

To Pass This Level: Must be able to swim 25-yards front crawl and backstroke, unassisted.

Level 5: Stroke Refinement – Ages 4-17

Skill Prerequisites: Must be able to swim 25-yards front crawl and backstroke, unassisted.

Participants refine their performance of all strokes (front crawl, backstroke, butterfly, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, and sidestroke), and increase the distance they swim. Participants learn to perform flip turns on their front and back, and tuck and pike surface dives.
