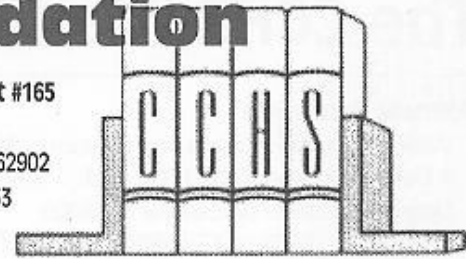

Five-Year Fund Raising Campaign

Since its inception in 1995, the goals of the Carbondale Community High School Education Foundation have been relatively simple:

- 1) Promote, encourage, and foster education in CCHS District 165
- 2) Develop community and public education programs, and provide information on such programs
- 3) Solicit and receive gifts and charitable contributions for the purpose of the support of the educational activities in CCHS District 165.

With the help of some outstanding individuals and hundreds of caring community members, we have been successful in raising over \$300,000 which helped to put the finishing touches on the NEW Carbondale Community High School:

- The Richard Kelley Weight Room

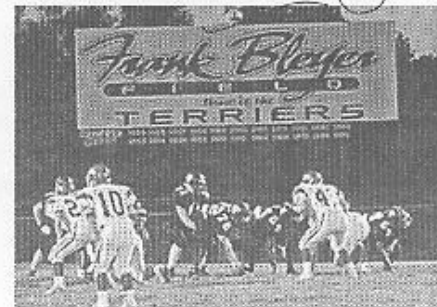
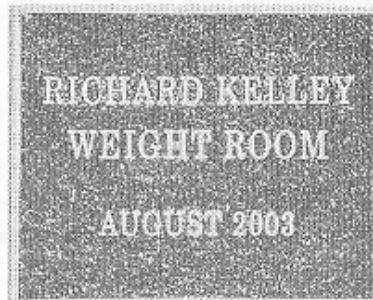
Financial support from the Carbondale community, CCHS alumni, faculty, staff and students pushed the building project forward. Encouragement and support from the CCHS Education Foundation also motivated other local organizations and individuals to get involved. Carbondale Community Arts raised over \$50,000 to commission a sculpture which now adorns the CCHS entrance. The Moore-Corpora Foundation donated \$100,000 over a four-year period to help fund the CCHS

Summer School Program. That was the easy part!

Now comes the hard part! To continue to fund the educational needs of our current and future students, the CCHS Education Foundation is embarking on an ambitious five-year campaign to raise \$500,000. These funds will be used to purchase materials and equipment necessary to provide our young adults with the quality education they deserve. Commitment Renewed

The Moore/Corpora Private Foundation again donates \$25,000 to the Carbondale Community High School Education Foundation, bringing their total contribution to \$100,000.

Four years ago Tom Corpora and Mary Kay Moore pledged \$100,000 to the CCHS Education Foundation, with the donation to be used for educational programs and services benefiting "at-risk" students. As a result of their generous donation, the CCHS Education Foundation was able to assist in funding a summer school program which has served well over 300 at-risk students. In addition, a portion of the donation supported a Foundation Grant Program which has awarded almost \$40,000 in grants to faculty and students at CCHS.

Mort Levine, Chairman of the CCHS Education Foundation, stated "The purpose of our Foundation is to promote, encourage, and foster education at CCHS, and Tom and Mary Kay, through their donation, have certainly assisted the Foundation in meeting its purpose. We are very fortunate to have individuals like Tom and Mary Kay willing to give something back to the students of CCHS and our community".

The Moore/Corpora Foundation recently renewed their commitment to CCHS with a pledge for additional contributions over the next four years.



Grants to Teachers Approved

At its meeting on May 9 the CCHS Education Foundation approved 25 grants to teachers of the school. Grants ranged from \$100 to \$800. The Total amount granted is \$11,858.00. This brings the total awarded in such grants to nearly \$50,000.00 during the last five years.

While the grants are not large in dollar terms, they often allow a substantial improvement in classroom teaching. Even though the district board provides generously for classroom needs, its resources are finite, and often just a few dollars more can bring about improved instruction.

This year's grants will provide equipment such as a laptop computer and projector, a data projector and a xylophone. Activities such as a summer camp, a tour for language students, and the use of S.I.U.'s Touch of Nature are also being subsidized.

This annual grant program comprises one of the several ways in which the CCHS Education Foundation is benefiting students of the school. These grants are made possible by the generous gifts that alumni and other friends of CCHS make to the Foundation. Potential donors should keep in mind the fact that all such gifts are tax deductible to the full extent of the law.

CCHS Hall of Achievement Program

At the suggestion of Mary Boyle and Larry Jackson, the C.C.H.S. Foundation Board, under the direction of Dr. David Kenney, initiated plans for a program to recognize outstanding C.C.H.S. alumni.

This program is intended to recognize alumni of Carbondale Community High School who have distinguished careers in business, the arts, the professions, public service, agriculture, athletics, or any other useful endeavor. Emphasis will be placed on service to our civil society as well as personal success. Each nomination will be carefully scrutinized by an anonymous committee, established by the Education Foundation Board of Directors.

It is expected that an actual hallway in the C.C.H.S. building will be reserved for portraits of those so honored. A public ceremony of induction will take place at least annually. 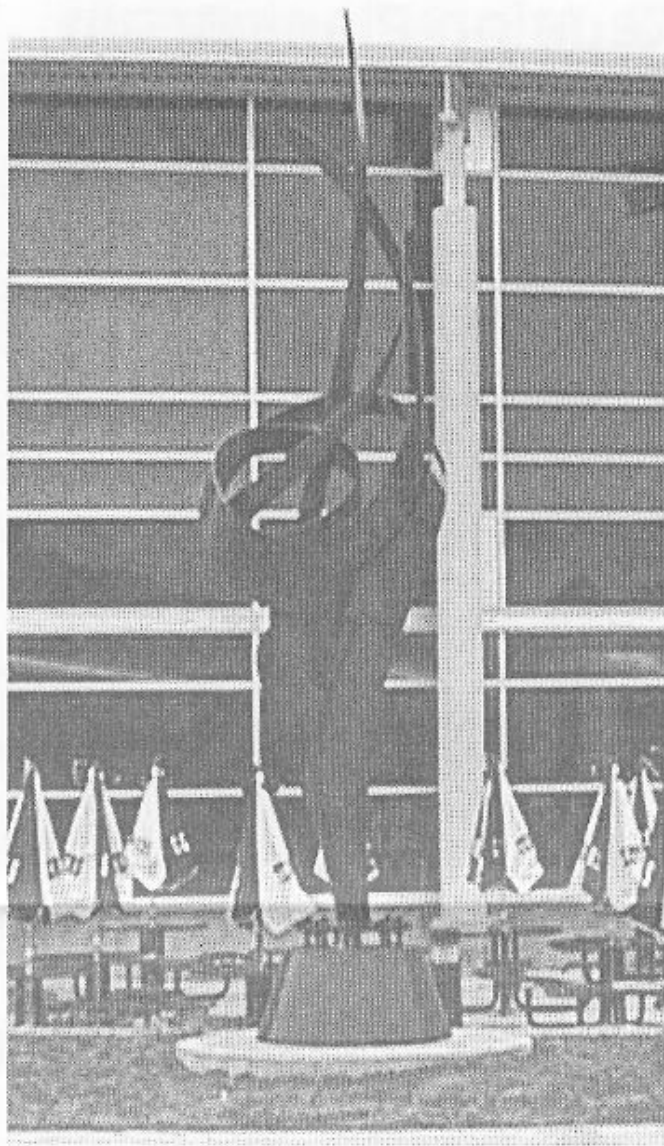

Friday p.m. - Mixer; open to all CCHS grads

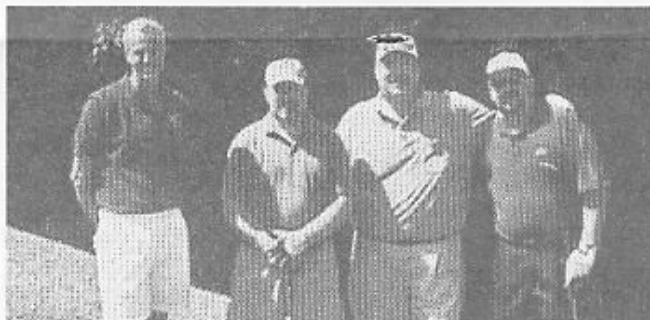
Saturday a.m. - Golf scramble; Hickory Ridge; perfect weather; great attendance including coaches, teachers, alumni and their families.

The CCHS Education Foundation has generously provided domain name www.cchsterriers.com and 400MB of storage for use in creating a website for the purpose of promoting CCHS to its alumni and friends. Prior to the creation of the current Web site the Foundation was on the Web through the generosity of Fran Thorne who maintained a site in her personal space. Beginning in 2004 we moved into our current Web space with our new domain name.

The Web site has grown from a few pages to a site of many pages on varying subjects occupying 150MB of space. A large percentage of the space used is dedicated to pictures from yearbooks and reunions. We still have 250MB of space available.

The Web site provides a space for classes to communicate with each other at varying levels. Some classes don't use the site at all, others simply use it as a link to their own individual Web sites, and still others use it to display pictures, class rosters, reunion announcements, etc. We provide space to classes interested in posting materials and can aid in the design and programming of individual Web pages. If a class has Web programming expertise in their midst they can design and maintain their own site and simply send us the pages to post.

Upon request the Foundation can provide a class roster derived from the Alumni Directory published some years ago. That roster can be used to begin searching for classmates and planning reunions. It can also be posted to the Web as a way to show who is "found", who is still "missing". An excellent way to "flesh out" the roster with a more complete set of names is to go through the four yearbooks covering a class, as well as the Graduation Program from the night of graduation ceremonies.

Once a reunion is planned, the Web has a Calendar page where the dates can be posted with links to more detailed information, including class and reunion contacts. Even if your class does not take advantage of posting information concerning rosters, missing classmates and pictures, you may still list your reunion dates, places, and contacts.

On 9-2-2004 hit counters were installed on three major menus in www.cchsterriers.com. As of Sept. '05 the counter on the main menu had received 3,859 hits.
