

Brian Myers hired to coach Greater Lowell Tech boys basketball team



LOWELL — After stops as the Lowell High girls and Dracut High boys basketball coach, Brian Myers was recently hired as the new head boys basketball coach at Greater Lowell Tech.

“I am both excited and honored to begin a new chapter as the next head coach of the boys basketball program at Greater Lowell Technical High School,” he said. “Our primary goal is to enrich the lives of our student-athletes through a set of core values designed to prepare students for life after high school. The resources and athletic department we have available here, in my opinion, are some of the best in the commonwealth. I look forward to alleviating some of the minutiae and focus on aspects of player development, identity, and accountability.

“I am hopeful we can regain some of the success the program had during coach Joe Kane’s tenure, specifically the 2014-19 stretch that included league titles and deep state tournament runs. I am eager to begin work with the student athletes representing our four sending districts of Lowell, Dracut, Tyngsboro, and Dunstable while building a program that is well respected across the state,” he added.

Myers coached the Lowell girls for six years and compiled a record of 79-51, before taking the Dracut position for five years, compiling a 37-35 record, including taking the Middies to the Division 3 state semifinal game in his first year at the helm.

He said the decision to head to Greater Lowell was relatively easy.

“The prospect of coaching in the same building ultimately became a driving force for change,” he said. “This will be the first time in my 22-year coaching career that I can consistently access the academics and community involvement of the student athletes in our program. We will utilize our established relationships with college coaches to provide opportunities for recruitment and secondary education. I am thankful for the opportunities that helped shape me at both Lowell and Dracut High School and hope to continue those successes here at Greater Lowell Technical.”
