Jeremiah Auguste of Lowell is the Senior of the Month. He has focused his technical studies in the area of Carpentry and maintains honor-roll grades in all classes. Jeremiah has made significant contributions to the Science program through his “Science Friday” presentations to staff and students that highlight such issues the destruction of Southeast Asian rain forests and the effect of invasive pythons in the Florida Everglades. His presentations often feature animal life, including a cockatoo and a ball python.

Jeremiah runs his own landscaping and plowing service. His course work at Greater Lowell has been preparing him for higher education, and he also looking forward to continuing as an entrepreneur by opening a second business.
