

GLTHS officially unveils \$65M renovation project

TYNGSBORO — Greater Lowell Technical High School recently held a dedication ceremony to celebrate and express thanks to all those responsible for the success of its \$65 million construction project.

More than 100 people attended, including state Sen. Eileen Donoghue and state Reps. Thomas Golden, David Nangle and Rady Mom, as well as local elected and municipal officials from Dracut, Dunstable, Lowell and Tyngsboro.

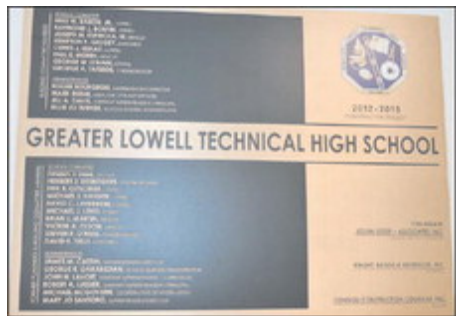
Aplaque was unveiled in the school lobby identifying the current and former School Committee members and administrators involved in the project’s planning, design and completion. School Committee Chairman Raymond Boutin expressed thanks to the committee members, past and present, as well as the many elected officials for their vision, advocacy and support throughout the project.

Sen. Donoghue noted that the building is welcoming and inviting, and that it is clear that the renovations will enhance the reputation of the school.

Rep. Golden remarked on how well the local delegation worked together to build a facility that will support technical education for many years to come.

Jack McCarthy, executive director of the Massachusetts School Building Authority, was pleased by the timeliness of the project’s completion and that it came in under budget.

GLTHS Superintendent- Director Roger Bourgeois said, “This was a very complex project, with extensive renovation work being performed in the evenings while the school remained in operation during the day.
