Did you know?

Attendance in school, has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

- * Students should miss no more than 8 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- * Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a challenge or facing some other difficulty.
- Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.
- Attendance is an important life skill that will help your son/daughter graduate from high school, college and keep a job for a successful career.

AT HOME

- Make attendance at school a priority.
- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day, and make that the expectation.
- Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
 - Find out if your child feels engaged by his/her classes and check the student portal on X2 to monitor progress.
 - Stay on top of progress and seek help from teachers or counselors, if necessary. Make sure teachers and counselors know the best way to contact you.
 - Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
 - Encourage meaningful after-school activities, including sports, clubs and the homework and tutoring center. Check out our school's website at www.gltech.org for more information.

COMMUNICATION

- Students are limited to 3 unexcused absences per quarter. Students exceeding this limit will not receive academic credit for all courses in the quarter.
