

On June 25, families and friends gathered in a celebratory spirit as the Class of 2024 took a giant step toward the future at the 65th Herricks High School Commencement

As members of the high school band performed "Pomp and Circumstance," the processional, led by valedictorian Devon Lee and salutatorian Dylan Lee, entered the stadium to cheers and applause.

Principal Joan Keegan opened the ceremony by inviting members of the senior class to welcome guests with a greeting in their native languages, a tradition that showcases the rich diversity within our community.

Nancy Feinstein, a member of the Board of Education, spoke on behalf of the Board. She reminded students to embrace their new chapter with imagination, courage and optimism. To those unclear of their future path she offered encouraging words.

"Don't sweat it," she said. "Not all who wander are lost. Some of us are just taking the scenic route."

Next, Ms. Keegan introduced Superintendent of Schools Dr. Tony Sinanis, who thanked families, teachers and staff for "nurturing inquisitiveness, encouraging critical thinking and cultivating a love of learning." Dr. Sinanis urged students to "put your whole heart into whatever you do. This allows you to gain clarity about who you are and what you believe in, both of which are essential for happiness and success in life."

Next on the dais, valedictorian Devon Lee and salutatorian Dylan Lee delivered a joint address that focused on compassion, individuality and time. They highlighted the joy of growing up as twins and the challenge to be recognized as individuals. This experience inspired their advice.

"Get to know someone for real," Dylan said.

"Everyone is different and should be appreciated for who they are rather than just a prejudice or biased assumption that you might see on the surface."

Devon encouraged classmates to cherish the memories but look towards the future. "It's been an incredible journey," he said, "and we should all be proud of ourselves as we turn to a new chapter in our lives. We know our futures are bright because we are ready."

This year's guest honoree was Director of Science and Technology Karen Hughes, who pushed back tears as she recounted her fears as a student and credited her parents for helping her develop life skills that have been critical to her 36 years as an educator. Ms. Hughes, who retired at the end of the school year, advised the graduates to build relationships and earn respect by making eye contact.

"Be really diligent in looking up from your phones to make new friends and to build new support systems," Ms. Hughes said. "These authentic personal interactions that you cultivate and nurture will ward off loneliness and bring you the greatest satisfaction throughout your life."

Before the diplomas were handed out, Jocelyn Chiu, the president of the Class of 2024 Student Government Executive Board, remarked about the talent, dedication and acceptance that is the hallmark of the Class of 2024.

Finally, the moment everyone had been waiting for arrived. Confetti flew and applause and cheers filled the air as diplomas were presented by Board of Education members and the graduates posed for photos.

Before the evening concluded, members of the Class of 2024 took part in the "turning of the tassels," and tossed their caps high in the air.
