

## Add Permalink to Canvas:

1. Open a Canvas Course and a Module.
2. Click the + icon within the module you would like to add the link.




## Adding the Embedded Code

2. From the drop-down menu select *Page*. Click *New Page* and then type a title for that Page.




3. Click on the page name within the module and then click *edit*.
