VI. BOARD PRESIDENT’S REPORT

Board President, Mr. Kenny, made the following statements:

- Thanked everyone for coming out and supporting the District.
- Congratulated the students that participated tonight in the Pledge of Allegiance and stated more students will be honored during the Superintendent’s report.
- Appreciates the different people who come out to the meetings because it’s good for the Board to see and hear from them.
- Dr. Piegari has served as Interim Superintendent and done very well. Dr. Piegari will be appointed this evening as the Interim Deputy Superintendent of Schools. Mr. Healy is in the audience and becomes the District’s Superintendent at midnight.
- Mr. Strimple, the Interim Business Administrator is preparing the budget. He will make sure the public is aware of the details of that budget.

- The mediation session with the MRTA scheduled for the 17th was cancelled due to a new mediator who was assigned not being able to make it.
- Ravine Drive PTO donated over \$15,000 for a sound system and \$5,600 for the purchase of seven white boards. These donations will impact students and learning for years and compliment the curriculum.
- This evening there will be a presentation on the anti-bullying campaign called “Kickin It.”

VII. SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT

Dr. Piegari, the Interim Superintendent of schools made the following statements.

- Made the audience aware that the transition of the new Superintendent will be seamless. Has been working with Mr. Healy and Ms. Deluca so everyone knows what is going on.
- Asked Ms. Bera to come to the podium.

Strathmore Elementary School Highlights - Ms. Bera, Principal.

Ms. Bera made the following statements:

- Welcomed the Board and administrators.
- The school has 506 students.
- Students in Kindergarten through the 3rd grade have improved their writing skills due to the writer’s workshop.
- There is student artwork throughout the building and have a mobile network.
- All 2nd and 3rd grade classrooms have promethean boards funded through the District and PTO. Is grateful to the Board of Education, PTO and technology department.
- Students have shown increased improvements in math due to the every day math program.
- 3rd graders will take the spring NWEA test next week which allows teachers to chart student achievement.
- Promoting healthy eating in the school.
- On April 27th 2nd grade students will be putting on a fashion show.
- April 27th is the School Board election and wants parents to register to vote.
- The staff at Strathmore raises money each month for a different charity.
- Max Dunphy, Maya McFadden and Luke Zibbell each received certificates from Mr. Kenny in honor of their service to the community.
- Recognized pledge leaders, Charles Richie, John Beukers, Michael Morris and Robert Delfino who is fluent in American Sign Language.

Presentation – Kickin It – Anti-Bullying National Campaign.

- Provided a summary of the campaign which seeks to reduce negative behavior and promotes open communication with administrators.

- Designs programs for students in Kindergarten through 12th grade.

Mr. Kenny stated his daughter is involved with “Kickin It”. It has raised funds to put marshal arts programs in the schools as well as offer teacher workshops as well. The goal is to provide students with a healthy school experience.

Mr. Kenny stated all feedback he has received has been positive.

VIII. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE’S REPORT

The student representative, Mr. Phillip Esposito made the following comments:

- At the High School the boys and girls basketball teams both qualified for the state tournament. The girls lost while the boys won. The wrestling team finished 3rd in the District tournament.
- The thespian society held auditions for Spring Musical which will be held March 31st through April 3rd.
- The speech and debate team held a fund raiser and attended a competition at Central High School in Newark where 11 members went to the final rounds.
- At MAMS the African American society will have an assembly against bullying and stereotyping.
- The science bowl team placed 3rd at a New Jersey Department of Energy tournament. Two teachers participated in a genetics research project and will each receive a \$250 stipend to buy supplies for their classrooms.
- The MAMS band received a grant to allow 7th graders to develop music.
- Lloyd Road held a Movie Night on February 25th.
- The Lloyd Road band is visiting the other schools within the District.
- Ravine Drive students read over 58,000 books and earned them second place in the statewide contest.
- Cliffwood Elementary school raised money for jump rope for heart and set a record for the most money raised.
- Cambridge Park Preschool students are participating in activities to fight cancer.

IX. PUBLIC COMMENTS RELATING TO BOARD AGENDA ITEMS

- Concerned with the school calendar for next year. The marking periods have various numbers of days. Ms. Deluca stated there is an error and will send him a corrected copy. There is no in-service on February 6th. Mr. Kosmyna also noted there is no comment regarding the maintenance and bus driver holidays. Ms. Deluca stated it is in the Board packet which she will also provide to him.
- Questioned why there was over \$750,000 in hand checks under the Finance agenda. Mr. Palumbo stated those are wires and include debt service and health benefit payments.

XII. FINANCE / TRANSPORTATION

Motion by Ms. Esposito, seconded by Ms. Hayward.

After meeting as The Committee of the Whole with the Superintendent, the Board approves the following items:

Mr. Strimple reviewed several new items under the Finance agenda.

- Item #7 is a request for Special Education Medicaid Initiative waiver. This waiver will allow the District to estimate revenue of \$20,000 for the program. The District is in the process of creating an action plan.
- Item #8 is for the submission of the District’s Extraordinary Aid Application. This will allow the District to recoup certain funds for Special Education expenditures.
- Items #9 through #12 involve the budget. The budget process for School Districts is lengthy and they must wait until the last minute when they receive

their state aid figures. Once the County Office signs off on the budget the Districts can advertise their budgets and can hold their public hearings. Our District will have its hearing on March 28th with the school election taking place on April 27th. Between now and March 27th Mr. Healy will review the budget. This budget was formulated by Dr. O’Malley and Ms. Irons.

- Reviewed the figures for the 2011-2012 Tentative Budget.
- Largest portion of the Capital Improvement Fund will be to fix a roof at Cambridge Park and ADA projects which are mandated.
- Tax levy is restricted to grow by 2%, although appropriations can grow more than that. Right now the tax levy increase is 1.69% for the 11/12 school year.
- Will be relying on free balance and receiving \$584,000 more in state aid than last year.
- The District will receive \$430,000 from the Federal Jobs Grant program.

Ms. Demarest questioned the large increase and decrease in certain accounts on the document handed to the Board. Mr. Strimple stated some items were budgeted incorrectly according to the chart of accounts and needed to be corrected.

- There will be a tax impact on the two communities due to the equalization valuation of the Regional District. For the homeowner with an average assessed home, there will be a tax decrease for Matawan of \$18 for the year and a tax increase for Aberdeen of approximately \$60 for the year.

Mr. Kenny stated the budget presentation will happen at next month’s meeting with a power point presentation.
