VI. BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Board President, Mr. Kenny, made the following statements:

- Thanked all the parents, guardians, teachers and administrators for coming to the meeting. It's always good for the Board to get out to the various schools.
- Ravine Drive, the only District school in Matawan is a great school with an exceptional Principal in Mrs. Janover.
- Dr. O'Malley has announced his resignation but there will be a smooth transition.
 The board has taken aggressive action and will hold a special meeting a week
 from tonight where all stakeholders of the District can communicate to the Board
 the characteristics they are looking for in their next superintendent.
- Also received the resignation of Business Administrator Ms. Susan Irons. Again, the Board does not expect any interruption of business.
- The MRTA and the Board have met several times but have jointly declared an impasse. This means assistance from a 3rd party mediator is necessary to reach an agreement.
- Pleased to report that the High School career academies are doing well. Our District has many capable students and the hope is to retain these students.
- Congratulated the football team that will play the State championship against Rumson Fair Haven.

- Acceptance of funds from the Matawan-Aberdeen Education Foundation. The foundation is led by a group of dedicated volunteers whose grants have seen tangible results.
- With Thanksgiving coming hoped everyone has something to be thankful for.
 Special thanks go out to members of our armed services, police and firefighters.
 Wished everyone a happy and healthy Thanksgiving.

VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. O'Malley asked Mrs. Janover to come to the podium.

Ravine Drive Elementary Highlights, Patricia Janover, Principal

Mrs. Janover reviewed the Ravine Drive Elementary School highlights.

- The staff and students have embraced the everyday math and writer's workshop programs.
- Everyone should read the students online magazine.
- This past week parents visited the school as the school celebrated American education week.
- Student work is displayed around the room.
- The staff of Ravine Drive infuses technology into the every day instruction.
- Students are participating in the great reading race. Last year, Ravine Drive earned 2nd place in the State of New Jersey.
- The bucket fillers campaign is a building initiative launched during School Violence Awareness Week. Students compliment each other on pieces of paper and then bring their papers home at the end of the week.
- Ravine Drive stresses community involvement. Students raised funds for the American Heart Association, breast cancer awareness and juvenile diabetes
- Colin Gray has been collecting aluminum tabs from cans and sending them to the Ronald McDonald House. Colin accepted a certificate of achievement from Mr. Kenny.

- Chartwells Presentation

Dr. O'Malley stated Mr. Jim Gillespie and Ms. Tara Powell will be making a presentation on Chartwells partnership with the District.

Mr. Jim Gillespie reviewed the three year relationship with the District:

- Chartwells has made a \$156,000 investment in the District
- \$89,000 went towards improvements in the elementary schools.
- Strathmore's cafeteria was remodeled. Dr. O'Malley and Ms. Irons went the extra mile to make it kid friendly.
- The most dramatic impact was at Cliffwood. They put in a set of ovens and some ranges, it's more kid friendly and the traffic flow is better.
- The Ravine Drive changes are mostly behind the scenes. The traffic flow was reversed to speed things up and was made more kid friendly. After the remodeling, the participation jumped from 40% to %60.
- Lloyd Road installed a full service deli and pizza station. Students have cold and hot foods like similar to the Middle School menu. The participation rate is consistently above 70%.
- At the Middle School there was a concern with the long lines so another POS
 was installed. In the two weeks since we have seen an extra 35 students taking
 meals.
- The High School has a cheese steak bar.

2010 Standardized Test Scores Presentation

Dr. O'Malley stated the 3rd presentation is the standardized test scores.

- The results of the standardized test scores were presented with a power point presentation which is included in the minutes.
- Ms. Zitarosa, Ms. Janover, Ms. O'Keefe, Mr. Farrell and Ms. Bera reviewed the elementary school results for the respective schools.
- Dr. Sheard, Mr. Blackmore and Ms. Ruscavage reviewed the scores for the Middle School and High School respectively.

Mr. Kenny thanked everyone for their presentation and noted that the numbers speak for themselves. The presentation will be made available on the District's website. Mr. Kenny stated the data is very important especially when used to measure the impact of the curriculum and see where the District can improve. The scores falling below proficiency are receiving the District's attention.

VIII. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

Mr. Kenny noted that Mr. Esposito placed 2nd at last week's speech and debate tournament.

The student representative, Mr. Phillip Esposito made the following comments:

- At the High School two members of the varsity field hockey team played in the all star game.
- Varsity football team has remained perfect. The Thanksgiving Day game has been rescheduled to November 27th.
- Speech and debate team had 11 finalists in the tournament. Team membership has increased so much that they had to limit the number of students.
- Middle School students will be visiting a planetarium.
- Lloyd Road had a costume parade and movie night. They also had parent teacher conferences.
- Ravine Drive kindergarten students participated in Native American day.
