In accordance with decisions issued by the School Ethics Commission and the Commissioner of Education in connection with the above-captioned matter, enclosed please find a Resolution of Suspension which the Commission adopted at its meeting on November 23, 2010.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:28-10.12(d), where the Commissioner imposes a penalty of censure, suspension or removal, a resolution shall be adopted at the Commission's next public following the Commissioner's decision and shall be read at the next public meeting of the district board of education following its adoption and posted in such places as the board posts its public notices for 30 days. Therefore, the Matawan-Aberdeen Regional School District Board of Education is directed to read this resolution at its next regularly scheduled public meeting and to post it in such places as the board posts it public notices for 30 days.

Mr. Kenny read the following Resolution of Suspension issued by Robert W. Bender, Chairperson, School Ethics Commission into public record.

WHEREAS, Jan Rubino is a member of the Matawan Aberdeen Regional School District Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, on August 31, 2010, the School Ethics Commission found that Ms. Rubino violated N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24(e), as well as N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24.1(e) and (f), of the School Ethics Act; and

WHEREAS, the Commission recommended that the Commissioner of Education impose a penalty of six-month suspension on Ms. Rubino; and

WHEREAS, by decision dated November 15, 2010, the Commissioner concurred with the Commission's recommendation and imposed a penalty of six-month suspension for Ms. Rubino; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:28-10.12(d) provides that, for a penalty of censure, suspension or removal, a Resolution shall be adopted at the Commission's next meeting following the Commissioner's decision and shall be read at the next public meeting of the district board or charter school board of trustees following its adoption and posted in such places as the board posts its public notices for 30 days;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the School Ethics Commission adopts this Resolution stating that Jan Rubino is hereby suspended for six months as a school official found to have violated the School Ethics Act; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Matawan Aberdeen Regional School District Board of Education is ordered to read this Resolution at its next regularly scheduled public meeting following the Commission's adoption on November 23, 2010 and the board's receipt of the Resolution and to post it in such places as the board posts it public notices for 30 days.

Whereas, the Board of Education has read into the record a resolution adopted by the School Ethics Commission memorializing Ms. Rubino's suspension; and Whereas, the Board of Education has reviewed the decisions of the Administrative Law Judge, the School Ethics Commission and the Commissioner of Education, finding that Ms. Rubino engaged in unethical behavior by e-mailing solicitations for campaign contributions to District employees at their District e-mail addresses, and concurs with those findings;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Matawan-Aberdeen Regional Board of Education hereby censures Jan Rubino for the unethical conduct resulting in her suspension from this Board;

Be It Further Resolved, that this Board of Education reaffirms its commitment to the rules of ethical behavior as prescribed by the School Ethics Act and the decisions of the School Ethics Commission.

Mr. Ruprecht stated that Jan Rubino has served on the Board for 9 years. She is only guilty of not finding the personal emails that she sent to friends who would have voted for her anyway. He finds it an embarrassing way for her to end her career especially since she has done good things for the students of the District.
