VII. BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Kenny made the following statements:

- The first meeting of the year on the road at the High School was a little different from the past. The building is in fabulous order and there is a lot to be excited about.
- Dhara Shah will lead the Pledge of Allegiance. She is President of the Matawan Regional High School honor society, co-President of the Science and math honor society and a member of the cross country and track teams. She plans to major in Biochemistry or Pharmacy.
- Ms. Phillips will sing the national anthem.
- Welcomed back the students, staff and parents.
- Attended back to school night this week which was well attended by the parents
 and reflects that education is a priority in the community. Thanked the teachers

XV. PUBLIC COMMENTS RELATING TO ADDITIONAL CONCERNS

Ms. Montgomery, Johnson Avenue, Matawan,

• Concerned with the bathroom situation in Ms. Perry's kindergarten classroom at Strathmore. Under NJAC all kindergarten classes must have a bathroom unless the District gets a waiver, which it has, but a second alternative must be made available. Currently, the students are using the bathroom in the nurse's office or 1st grade wing at 10am and 2pm. The problem is kids don't go to the bathroom on command or the nurse is not always in her office. Students can not be left unsupervised. There are also health concerns because there may be sick students in the nurse's office. Another concern is that according to NJAC, instructional time can not be infringed upon and according to Ms. Perry 20 or 30 minutes of

instructional time is lost. Mr. Kenny stated the matter has come to his attention and is currently speaking to the administration and legal council. However, he can't say what will be done or when the matter will be addressed. Appreciates their concerns because he has children in the District as well.

Ms. Narra, 189 Fordham Drive,

 Would like to know the time frame for a resolution to the bathroom problem in Ms. Perry's class. Mr. Kenny stated there is no specific time frame.

Ms. Rubino stated that she didn't even know there was a problem at Strathmore until this discussion.

Ms. Perry, Aberdeen, NJ,

• Is the kindergarten teacher in room 28 at Strathmore School. The education in her classroom is being compromised because she is required to take the children every day to the bathroom by the main office and often spends 20 minutes in the hallway. Secondly, the nurse's office is not always available. This requires the instructional assistant to leave the classroom in order to escort children to the bathroom. Implores the Board to put something into effect so the children can be taken to the bathroom.

Ms. Robinson, 461 Sonia Avenue,

- Thanked Mr. Kenny for speaking to her and stated it's wonderful to have a Board President who will shake her hand and take care of here children.
- Addressed the Social Studies program in the District. Believes a teacher in the
 District has a problem with her family because her son played Barack Obama and
 went around to the different classrooms. Also, her son didn't make the basketball
 team and doesn't understand why, maybe his basketball coach was a republican.

Ms. Mirfield, Canfield Drive, Aberdeen.

There are many concerns parents are worried about with the bathroom situation.
 Students may get in trouble or there could be health issues. These problems need to be taken seriously.

Mr. Pedell, Onyx Place,

Supports the parents speaking about the bathroom issue at Strathmore. Parents
have volunteered to come to the school and take the students to the bathroom but
Ms. Bera said that's not acceptable.

Mr. Mariniella, 500 Lloyd Road,

 How is the District planning on using the federal stimulus money? Mr. Kenny stated its use has not been determined yet. The Commissioner of Education recommended that it not be spent right away.

- Questioned if class size has changed from this year to last year. Dr. O'Malley it has especially at the Middle School due to less staff.
- When will teacher evaluations be online? Dr. O'Malley stated guidelines will be issued and that the District will follow State protocol.

Ms. Gentile, 10 Crescent Place, Matawan,

- Can the students at Strathmore use an adjoining classroom's bathroom? Mr. Kenny stated he not sure of the exact situation.
- Likes the progress of changes in the District however, she is concerned with the SAT scores at the High School being flat or dropping. Mr. Kenny the District has high performing students and the figures Ms. Gentile is speaking of doesn't show the improvements being made.

Ms. Maclioco,

 Her daughter is in Ms. Perry's kindergarten class and is also concerned with the bathroom situation. Believes the Board should give Ms. Perry some help because there is a health issue. Mr. Kenny stated he appreciates her comments.

Mr. Leed, Aberdeen,

- Education and safety should be the Board's priorities and Ms. Rubino stated she doesn't even know about the bathroom issue. Ms. Perry always had a bathroom before until the learning disability class took the room. Would like to know what's going on.
- Is still waiting on the Board to get back to him regarding the class size situation.

Ms. Gallo, Independence Drive,

Her daughter throws up when she cries, so she would like the bathroom issue solved very quickly.

Ms. Maclioco,

Questioned why the parents weren't notified when the bathroom issue arose so it could have been resolved prior to the start of school.

Ms. Maybon, Park Avenue, Matawan,

Concerned with the bathroom situation as well. This is a big transition for the students and doesn't understand why a seasoned teacher like Ms. Perry has to deal with this. Would like to see someone hired to help with the children. Also believes that her daughter will be at a disadvantage due to the loss of instructional time.

Ms. Robinson, 461 Sonia Avenue,

• Her son did great in kindergarten and he didn't have a bathroom in the classroom. Ms. Perry should follow Ms. Doyle's procedures.

Mr. Kenny stated everyone should be respectful to all points of view presented and to all people who come up to speak.

• The basketball coach lives in her neighborhood and is concerned with her safety and does not want her daughter to be around him. Mr. Kenny stated any concerns should be brought to the attention of the building principal.

Ms. Moreno,

• Stated children have to go to the bathroom when they need to go and students should not go to the nurse's office unless they are sick. The parents will continue to show up at the meetings until the situation is resolved.
