#### VI. BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Kenny made the following statements:

- The District is preparing for the upcoming school year.
- Mr. Blackmore has taken over at the Middle School and is looking forward to his leadership there.
- Ms. Deluca and Ms. Ruscavage reviewed the three academies at the previous board meeting.
- Wished everyone a safe and healthy remainder of the summer.
- Public Hearing comments on Business Administrator's contract:

Mr. Kenny asked if any members of the Board or public had any questions or comments regarding Ms. Irons contract.

#### VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. O'Malley made the following comments:

- There are still ten vacancies open but they will be filled by the opening of school.
- There is an enrollment problem in Kindergarten at Ravine Drive. 100 students are enrolled with four teachers bringing the classroom average to 25. If the

enrollment gets any larger the District may have to offer another section. At this time last year the enrollment was at 70 students.

# VIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS RELATING TO BOARD AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Kosmyna, 1 Central Avenue, Old Bridge,

- Questions regarding the Personnel Agenda.
- Was Ms. Deluca the only applicant for the position of Deputy Superintendent?
   Dr. O'Malley stated she was the only candidate that would be transferred up to that position.
- The appointment of secretary to fill the position left by Susan Sweeney. Five people were interviewed and the position was given to a non-tenured staff member who was riffed. Of the five people who interviewed, were they the other secretaries who were riffed. Mr. Kenny answered that it's the subject of grievance and being addressed in litigation at this time. It is also a part of union negotiations so he can not comment.
- There are a number of instructional assistants and personal aides being hired as well which will be part of another grievance filed by the union. They are being hired on steps other than steps 1 or 2. Mr. Kenny thanked Mr. Kosmyna for the notice.
- Inquired if the billing coordinator is a new position. Mr. Kenny stated it is a new position. Mr. Kosmyna asked if there was a job description for this position and if so could he see it. Mr. Kenny stated all the positions in the District have a job description and he would need to request a copy through normal process.
- A teacher on the staffing array was transferred from a BD class at Cliffwood to a LLD class at Strathmore. Was this done at the request of the teacher? Dr. O'Malley stated that it is his understanding that it was a voluntary transfer. Mr. Kosmyna asked if this was a new class. Dr. O'Malley stated the class was there all of last year.

#### IX. PROGRAM

Motion by Ms. Esposito, seconded by Dr. Delaney

Mr. Warren requested to separate the Reading Recovery portion of staff travel for an independent vote.

Mr. Warren is recommending against spending nearly \$5,000 for travel for Reading Recovery.

Ms. Demarest asked if the cost and number of Out of District placements differed from last year. Dr. O'Malley stated there is one less student but the cost is about the same. There is one new placement but nothing has gone up or down dramatically.

After meeting as The Committee of the Whole with the Superintendent, the Board approves the following items:

#### X. PERSONNEL

Motion by Ms. Esposito, seconded by Dr. Delaney

Ms. Demarest requested that Item C-14 on the Program Agenda be separated for an independent vote.

Ms. Hayward asked if two additional HSPA prep classes were added because of an increase of students. Dr. O'Malley stated the District had 41 students enrolled so he wanted to add another section. Mr. Kenny noted that the administration went through great efforts to get students to participate.

Mr. Ruprecht asked if there were any changes to the contract under Personnel Item #14. Mr. Kenny stated the contract is identical except the change in the term and the increase in contribution to the health benefits. There was no increase in salary.

Mr. Warren congratulated Ms. Deluca and stated he is thrilled to have her as Deputy Superintendent.

Mr. Warren noted that he was pleased to see Sheila Caldwell joining the District. She is very familiar to the Board.

Mr. Warren made the strongest recommendations for Ms. Irons. The situation prior to her arrival was terrible and has improved dramatically since she came.

 Mr. Kosmyna asked if Ms. Irons is contributing 1.5% of her salary or premium towards the benefits. Mr. Kenny stated is 1.5% of her salary.

Mr. Kenny stated he is personally pleased that Ms. Irons contract is before the Board for renewal. She is an asset to the District and the Board is happy to have her. She has saved the District a tremendous amount of money especially in contract negotiations and has made this a blue ribbon, fiscally sound District. Thanked Ms. Irons for her commitment.

Dr. Delaney stated he gets around to other Districts and it is widely recognized that Ms. Irons is one of the top three BAs in the county. Noted that she voluntarily accepted the no raise contract and thanked her for the outstanding job she has done.

Ms. Rubino questioned the change to the Personnel attachment. Ms. Irons stated the appointments should be shifted down after the School Newspaper, Page 3 of 6 of the attachment.
