VI. BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Kenny made the following statements:

- Aberdeen Chief of Police, John Powers, was in attendance to honor Anthony Cassano, the longtime crossing guard at Lloyd Road.
- Congratulated the High School band whom several weeks ago hosted a Band Competition where there was a great turnout.
- The District has had many positive moments. Attended the National Honor Society induction on October 15th. On Tuesday October 27th the process for the completing a new Mission and Vision statement will continue which Dr. Gambino will be hosting. The Mission and Vision statements establish why we are here and what we would like to do. The Board would like to receive public input.

- On Wednesday October 28th the District will be hosting a forum on the H1N1 virus will be at the High School. The Monmouth County Board of Health will be presenting information on the virus.
- The District has had great success with standardized test scores as noted in the Asbury Park Press. The students are meeting the required progress but will continue to strive to achieve greater results.
- The public will hear from the Superintendent about the Violence and Vandalism Report. Our District has seen a decrease in incidences.
- Finally, commended parents for giving up their time and coming to the meeting.

VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Lloyd Road School Highlights – Ms. Pat O'Keefe, Principal

Dr. O'Malley thanked Ms. O'Keefe, Mr. Abrahamson and the PTO for the refreshments and asked them to come to the podium.

Ms. O'Keefe welcomed the Board of Education and members of the community and then reviewed Lloyd Road's highlights:

- The school year is off to a great start with "Back to School Night" being standing room only.
- Enrollment has remained constant with around 570 students.
- With respect to curriculum, the school is in its 2nd year of Everyday Math and there is a new social studies series with new textbooks for students that can be accessed anytime online.
- New technology is being introduced into the classrooms.
- There have been improvements to the cafeteria. There is a new section called the
 trattoria where students can get fresh pizza and sandwich central for made to
 orders sandwiches. Students are enjoying their lunches and the number of
 purchased lunches has soared.
- Recognized the PTO for how active they are. Last Friday was Halloween Bingo and tomorrow is pumpkin painting.
- Purchased an overhead calculator which allows the students to follow along with the teacher.
- Recognized the student artwork hanging up.

Mr. Abrahamson came up to the podium:

- Presented the Community Service Award Recipient to Mr. Anthony Cassano, who has been the crossing guard at Lloyd Road for a very long time. Mr. Cassano ensures the safety of the children everyday and is always out there smiling and waiving hello to everyone. Thanked Chief Powers, LT. Al Guyers and Anthony's family who are here tonight to honor Mr. Cassano.
- There was a second recognition for the Band ensemble. They represent over 250 students who participate in the instrumental band road program at Lloyd Road.
- The Lloyd Road band played a short musical selection.
- The students in the band were called up to receive Certificates of Recognition from the Board of Education. Also receiving Recognition, Lyn Lewis, the Instrumental Teacher and Band Conductor; Susanne Hughes, the Band Teacher and Conductor; Mr. Mike Haughey who joins the band for special events and finally Vocal Music Teacher Janet Breslin who could not be here tonight because of the passing of her mother, Edith Kaufman, who was a teacher in the District for a long time.

- Public Hearing - Violence and Vandalism 2008-2009

Dr. O'Malley reviewed the Violence and Vandalism Report from 2008-2009:

• As per State Statute, the Superintendent must report to the Board annually on occurrences from the previous year. There were 27 acts of violence and vandalism, down from 42 the previous year. The High School had 14 instances of violence, vandalism, weapons and substance abuse. In the Middle School there were 13 acts of violence and vandalism. The acts of violence and vandalism have decreased dramatically. The District is maintaining a safe and sound learning environment. Dr. O'Malley asked if anyone from the public had any questions regarding the report to which no one come forward.

- Presentation - 2008-2009 - Audit

Mr. Robert Hulsart Jr. of Robert A. Hulsart & Company presented the Audit to the Board.

- The result of the audit was excellent.
- The district is in good financial standing.
- \$250,000 was put in an Emergency Reserve to help offset future unexpected costs.

- Funds were also put in Capital Reserve for future District projects such as ADA work.
- The District did not defer the pension obligation as it could have elected to do.
- There was no tax increase.
- \$450,000 was put in the budget towards tax relief while next year \$550,000 was put towards tax relief to offset some \$100,000 in revenue that will be lost.
- Spent a lot time on internal controls and visited many departments with Ms. Irons
 to view employees and to see if the procedures are working. Went into the
 departments unannounced. The employers were well aware of what their
 responsibilities are.
- ARRA funds are being received. There are numerous accounting and regulation requirements for these funds. The District is in compliance with those regulations.
- There was one recommendation in the audit. The recommendation was in the Athletic fund. The Athletic department needs to maintain all tickets so ticket sales for events can be verified. The Athletic Director was destroying the leftover tickets. As detailed in the Corrective Action Plan, the Business Office is working with Athletic Department to ensure an inventory of all tickets is being maintained so sales can be verified for audit.
- It is important for the District to look 2 or 3 years down the road in an effort to anticipate any new regulations that may come about.

Mr. Hulsart took questions from the Board:

Mr. O'Connell asked about the extra curricular clubs and the High School store inventory. Mr. Hulsart stated they are being taken care of. by the District.

Mr. O'Connell also inquired about the Maroon and Steel Club. Mr. Hulsart stated that club is not included in District funds and was not part of the audit.

Mr. O'Connell asked about the District's Debt to Asset ratio.

VIII. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

The student representative, Andrew Monagle made the follow statements:

- On October 9th, Ravine Drive participated in the Jump Starts Reading campaign.
- Ravine Drive also had wellness day on October 20th, which focused on exercise and good food choices.

- The High School had its annual competition between classes including the Powder Puff football game which the seniors won.
- The High School athletic teams are having a great year. Both the boys and girls soccer teams made it to the State tournament. The girls' team had the best record in Matawan history.
- Congratulated the students who were inducted into National Honor Society.
- The Band Competition was held at the High School. Thanked everyone for their support.
- Congratulated the Lloyd Road band for its performance.
- Encouraged teachers and administrators to give him input on what to include in his monthly report.

The Board had several questions and comments:

Mr. O'Connell requested a separate vote on item #13 of the Finance Agenda, the Standard Operating Procedures and Internal Control Manuals.

Mr. O'Connell had several questions on the Bills list.

- On Page 10 there is a \$44,000 PO to CDW. Ms. Irons stated this was a
 Cooperative agreement. Mr. O'Connell asked if this PO is done prior to Board
 Approval. Ms. Irons stated it was done after Board approval and she will get the
 date of approval.
- Mr. O'Connell inquired about the Educational Data orders. Ms. Irons stated the Board has already taken action to approve the Educational Data bid items. Anything over \$10,000 must have Board approval.

XIII. COMMENTS & QUESTIONS FROM PUBLIC RELATING TO ADDITIONAL CONCERNS

Various Aberdeen and Matawan residents made comments, expressed concern, and/or raised questions regarding the following items to which Mr. Kenny and Dr. O'Malley responded:

Ms. Brenner, Matawan, NJ,

• She and her son signed the District's code of conduct which they have never violated unlike Joe Martucci and his staff. Her son spoke to Mr. Martucci about students being cursed at and manhandled. There is a favoritism that exists among the coaches for certain players. Mr. Kenny stopped Ms. Brenner to make her aware that she can speak her mind but generally the Board does not get involved until matters have been addressed internally by Administrators first. Ms. Brenner continued to speak and stated her son went to Mr. Martucci and told him that he wanted to quit the football team because he was unhappy with the program. She claimed Mr. Martucci told her son that he was selfish and never to ask him or come to him for help. Her son has received phone calls from other players on the team about what was said about him during practice. She is asking Mr. Martucci to step down as Athletic Director. Is afraid that her son could have a bias against him when he goes out for the baseball team.

Ms. Long, Cliffwood,

• Claimed this is another situation that has involved Coach Martucci and would like to know when enough is enough. Would like to know when does the Board get involved? Where should she go to discuss incidents at the High School? Mr. Kenny stated if the proper procedures are being followed then the discussion can continue. The Board takes these concerns very seriously however by law the Board can not speak about an individual employee during a public meeting. The process should go through the administration, such as School Principal first, then to the Deputy Superintendent and Superintendent.

Mr. Mariniella, Lloyd Road,

• Positions and programs are being added through the utilization of the ARRA funding but is still not clear after reading the article that 25 teacher positions are being saved. Dr. O'Malley stated there are several aspects of the stimulus money. The District received two separate amounts. There is regular Title I

funding and ARRA Title I funding. There is also regular IDEA funding and ARRA IDEA funding. The State legislature and Governor legislated that the \$1.7 Million in normal ARRA funding for Equalization Aid is now State Aid. The District has to list which jobs were saved through the use of the ARRA funding.

Still have not seen what the progress of the RTI program. Dr. O'Malley stated
that next month the results will be part of a presentation.

Ms. D'Agostino, 46 Amboy Road,

Thanked the Board for having Special Education programs for children who need
it.

Mr. Pedell, 87 Onyx Place,

• If the State offers a certain amount of stimulus money and that disappears, how will that effect the way the schools are run. Mr. Kenny stated that last year the District anticipated and planned for the hard economic times. There was a zero tax levy increase and a lot was cut from the budget. Anticipates that this is being done now in anticipation of what is coming for the next fiscal year. Dr. O'Malley stated that there is a 4% tax levy cap which the District automatically exceeds with salary and benefit increases. The budget process must start earlier each year. Mr. Pedell stated there is only so much cutting that can be done. The tax levy will have to increase. Mr. Kenny stated Dr. O'Malley has a financial background, not just educational which will come to serve the District greatly.

XIV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Mr. Kenny stated the general approach to implementing a new policy book. With Dr. Delaney's help, the District has passed all the policies necessary for QSAC. Mr. Kenny wants the Board to review the bylaw series which are the 0 series and the 1000 series of policies and be able to discuss them at the next Committee meeting. After the discussion at the next Committee meeting, the Board should try to adopt some policies at its next Action meeting. Ms. Rubino stated the District has already adopted some of the 1000 series polices to which Mr. Kenny replied yes.
- Mr. Kenny noted that Mr. O'Connell did a tremendous job in facilitating the Goals Session and would like propose the goals in a motion, unless Mr. O'Connell would like to change some of the wording.
- Mr. Warren raised one more issue regarding the policies under consideration. He
 would like the Board to give special attention to policies not mandated by law.
 The CSA can't know all of the laws by heart.
- Mr. O'Connell gave his reasoning for voting "no" on the minutes of the previous Board meeting. There was a substantial discussion about the policies and would like the minutes to reflect the outcome of the meeting. Noted that Mr. Mariniella

asked about a follow up question about the RTI program and would like to see that answer followed through to the next meeting.

- Mr. O'Connell would like to determine the role of the Board. The chain of command has to be followed. If a parent has a problem with a teacher they should go to the teacher first, then the building Principal, followed by the CSA and ultimately the Board. Parents should make their voices heard.
- There was a discussion regarding the language of the goals. Mr. O'Connell stated the Board should move forward with the 1st goal.
- Mr. Ruprecht stated that the word "reading" should be dropped from the second sentence of goal #1. The sentence should start with "Progress."

Motion by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Dr. Delaney, to accept goal #1 for the 2009-2010 school year. Goal #1 states that "all students will be reading and writing at grade level by the end of the 3rd grade by school year 2011-2012. Progress will be maintained and measured by cohort going forward.

XV. NEW BUSINESS

- Mr. Warren wanted to commend Ms. Irons on a fantastic audit in addition to the zero tax levy increase.

Parents are able to look online and check student progress. In the future the District can check progress of students over the course of time.
- There is a ticket system that displays how long things are broken and how long it takes to correct the problems.
- ARRA technology has been integrated into the Special Education Program.
- Ms. Gallagher has trained with Schoolwire Systems.
- For professional development, Mr. Farley and Mr. Dugal have hosted seminars.
- The use of technology in the classroom was discussed along with the use of technology by District staff.

- The process of collecting data from every class that a student is involved will being. In 10 years the District could have a substantial amount of data to track programs and see the impact on students.
- The possibility of the technology group starting a pilot program for an online class.
- Mr. Warren believes the Mission and Vision statements should contain a concept for great citizenship and community awareness

Ms. Irons stated the teachers pay the union through a payroll deduction and then the District sends a payroll agency check made out to the union every month. The annual payment amount is around \$435,000. The average teacher pays about \$1,008 annually to the union no matter what pay level.
- Mr. Kenny wanted to recognize Darlene Gallagher and the technology department for receiving an award for the District's website from School Boards. The website is successful and is user friendly.
