• Allows parents to put money on account by credit and see what their children are purchasing for lunch. Reviewed the process of showing how parents can log onto their accounts. An auto-pay feature is available to allow for the automatic replenishment of the account when it reaches a certain amount. There is a small fee of about 4% per payment when you put money in the account

Mr. O'Connell asked about the 4% charge. The charge is collected by the company when money is put into the account with a credit card. If a parents sends in cash there will not be a charge. A parent can also restrict the food their children are purchasing.

• Expressed his concern over the 2nd grade class sizes at Strathmore. The average sizes of those classes are about 24 or 25 kids per class. At Cliffwood and Ravine the average size is about 16 or 17. Mr. Kenny stated the Board and Administration have noticed the class size. The numbers are little more than what they want, but the classes are not overcrowded. The population from time to time will fluctuate and they will need to take a look at the District's borders to see where the students are coming from. Mr. Lietz requested that in class support be given.

Thanked the Board for its support of the girl scouts. She is a scout leader for a
troop and all the scouts are working hard toward their goal of a gold award and
chose to give back to the community. Mr. Kenny stated he is proud to see the

the girl scouts since he was an Eagle Scout himself.
