# VI. BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Board President, Mr. Kenny made the following statements:

- This is an exciting time for the District as school will begin next week.
- Proud of the launching of the District's Academies which provide a rigorous academic curriculum within the High School. The new curriculum was developed by the administrators and teachers throughout the year. Students will not have to leave our High School to take advantage of this program. He is confident students will benefit from the program.
- The results of the NWEA testing program are presented in a timely manner.
- The NWEA has had a positive impact. The Special Education needs have been addressed. Teachers have been given advanced training with Autism within the District.
- Student packets were mailed out last week.
- Academic advancements without a tax increase and a budget that the public supported for the first time in 8 years.

# VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

2009-2010 School Year Highlights

Dr. O'Malley reviewed the highlights of the District for the upcoming 2009/2010 school year.

- This school year begins with approximately 3,900 students, 25 new staff members and 2 new principals.
- District is financially sound for the new school year. An Emergency Fund has been set up and the District maintains its 2% surplus.
- There was no increase in taxes or food service costs and there was a decrease in the subscription busing cost.
- Chartwells improved the food lines at the Lloyd Road and Ravine Drive elementary schools.
- Transportation routes will run smoothly, including the early runs.
- The curriculum has been updated and there are 3 new career academies.
- NWEA benchmarking which has given the District a predictability level on standardized tests. The 5<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grades were within a percentage point of what the administration had targeted.
- Less students are going out of district and more students are being kept within.
- Hopes to hire a behaviorist while continually improving the District's special education program.
- Cycle 1 reports have indicated strong results in areas where resources were put, including Math and Science
- Language Arts results were weak and will need to improve in 2009/2010.
- The Technology initiative is continuing with the purchase of new promethean boards by the PTO and District. High School labs will include cloud computing.
- The parental portal for RealTime should be accessible within the year.
- The 21<sup>st</sup> century learning initiative will continue in all 3 elementary schools while the ESL program will be working with IPODs to develop learning skills.
- The Board will continue updating it policies.
- The District did well in 3 of the 5 areas QSAC reviews. The final 2 areas of QSAC will occur later in the year.
- Balanced score cards will be used to ensure progress in all areas.

# XII. COMMENTS & QUESTIONS FROM PUBLIC RELATING TO ADDITIONAL CONCERNS

Various Aberdeen and Matawan residents made comments, expressed concern, and/or raised questions regarding the following items to which Mr. Kenny and Dr. O'Malley responded:

Ms. Nappi, 225 Lloyd Road, Aberdeen,

• There was approximately \$12,000 in the Program Agenda under travel and reimbursable expenses for professional development. In light of the State's new guidelines, how is the school based professional development going to be effected? Mr. Kenny responded that Dr. O'Malley is familiar with the regulations. Dr. O'Malley stated most of the professional development on the agenda is for teachers and administrators. These are more for personal improvement. The science convention is a great example. Teachers are doing much better as shown by results. The District should not jump on what the State is doing as evidenced by the Preschool program.

 With respect to the NJ ASK scores is the District looking at the curriculum work done and the Language Arts scores in grades 3 and 4. Would like to see curriculum writing. Dr. O'Malley stated the curriculum is being updated with either Columbia or Rutgers.

# XIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- A discussion took place among Board members regarding the preparation of Matawan-Aberdeen students for college. The Board discussed success rates for students attending and graduating from 2 and 4 year schools. The quality of the schools attended by students was also debated along with the idea that students are receiving the proper counseling while at the High School. Mr. Warren would like to establish a metric and give it to the administration to display they are concerned with the graduation rates of our students at colleges and ensure they are prepared to attend and graduate from these institutions.
- Mr. Kenny stated the graduation rates and success of our students at
  college is an important discussion to have and this could be discussed with
  the goals of the Board at the next Committee meeting. Ms. Rubino was
  looking for all the goals of the District and would like to have them in
  place for the beginning of the school year.
- Mr. O'Connell would like to visit a couple of the Out of District institutions where some of our Special Education students are located.
   Mr. Kenny stated the issue has been discussed with Dr. O'Malley and it would be possible to organize a trip.
- Mr. O'Connell applauded the balanced score cards that Dr. O'Malley created. In the future the score cards can show the progress of the District.
- Mr. O'Connell stated IBM has nothing to do with the cloud computing of the District. Cloud computing however does reduce cost and allows access very quickly.
- Mr. Ruprecht would like to make a motion regarding the nepotism policy. The State allowed for an option in the policy whereby a child of a Board member should not be precluded from getting a job involved within the learning environment of that specific District. Ms. Rubino seconded the motion. Mr. Warren believes the Board should be worried about the appearances that the children of Board members are in paid positions. Dr. Delaney wants safeguards in with respect to the hiring process. A more detailed discussion took place among Board members. Mr. Ruprecht agreed to table his motion until Dr. O'Malley could put guidelines in place

to ensure that educational opportunities are involved in the selection criteria.
