V. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. O'Malley stated there will be three presentations this evening beginning with Kevin Bush from Source 4 Teachers.

Kevin Bush - Source 4 Teachers

Mr. Bush reviewed the handout given to the Board members:

- The company was founded 7 years ago.
- Can reduce overall cost to districts by over 10% of total payroll. Our District could see a savings of over \$163,000.
- New teachers are always being recruited, often right out of college.
- Recruit, interview, hire and then train the teachers coming in.
- Hire substitutes from the community and will always give them the right of first refusal to work within the District.
- Check backgrounds including criminal history and fingerprinting.
- Have an AESOP like technology system to track absences.
- Attract teachers by giving benefits such as retirement plans and unemployment, and allows teachers to get their foot in the door.

There were several comments and questions from the Board:

- Does permission need to be given by the employees to have their information given to Source 4 Teachers? Teachers will have to apply to Source 4 Teachers to become eligible to substitute.
- Substitutes will not need to get fingerprinted again since the District has their records on file already. The company will verify certification and background with State prior to hire.
- Are the rates for the substitutes contracted? Dr. O'Malley stated the District can continue with the current rates or change them to whatever the Board may want.
- The Board can review the list of substitutes maintained by the company.
- There are enough substitutes to expand among more districts. Source 4 Teachers is constantly recruiting.
- Source 4 Teachers is registered with the Department of Education however, Mr. Bush is not sure with which division.

- The only savings to the District is the difference in cost for the substitutes pay.
- All of the substitutes hold certifications. Some of the teachers only hold substitute certificates while others are fully certified teachers.
- Only 60 college credits are needed to hold a substitute certification. A degree is not necessary.
- The substitute teachers are employees of Source 4 Teachers.
- Most of Source 4 Teachers employees are recent graduates.
- There is a database of teachers who substitute in specific subjects such as Italian. If they do not have a teacher for a specific subject, they will go out and recruit them.
- Teachers that do not work for the company may be hired as substitutes.
- If a teacher is not available to substitute in the District, a credit will be given.
- A benefit of having internal substitutes is that most live within 5 or 10 minutes from District schools.
- \$7,299 is the threshold in earnings in order for the substitutes to be eligible to collect unemployment.
- Dr. O'Malley will provide recommendations from other Superintendents who have utilized the service.
- Teachers can freelance and work in other Districts at any point.
 Source 4 Teachers will never stop anyone from working.
- 6:00 AM is the best time to request a substitute however, one can be requested all the way up to noon.

Joe Martucci - Hall of Fame Wall

Mr. Martucci discussed the Hall of Fame Wall:

• The Football Alumni Association wanted to put something together to honor alumni.

- First idea was a ring of honor around the gym but that wasn't going to be large enough to honor all athletes. Came up with the idea for the Husky Alumni Park.
- Involves selling red paver bricks for \$50 or \$100 on which
 people could engrave their names or whatever they wanted. The
 cost of the bricks would pay for the wall with no cost to the
 District.
- The wall would beautify the stadium and there is room on it for other sports organizations or for any alumni.
- The Alumni Association is asking the Board for permission to use the land to build the wall. The Board of Education owns the land.

There were several comments and questions from the Board:

- Others sports that wanted to be added to the wall could be placed on the edges or an additional structure could be built.
- Maintenance of the wall will be the responsibility of the Alumni Association.
- The wall will be located by the gate where the opposing band enters, behind the press box. No space will be lost, there is a grass area that is not being utilized.
- A permit may bed needed for construction of the wall. When and if the Board gives approval to move forward, the association will look into getting the proper paperwork.
- Groundbreaking could be at the beginning of the 2010/2011 school year.
- The wall is not only for the football alumni. Other organizations can be added and there is more than enough room for expansion.
- An academic hall of fame is located in the High School near the auditorium.
- The wall looks like a football monument. Other sports can join in however, since the Football Alumni Association stepped up and took the look, they will have the prime positions on the wall.

Woody Dillaha, Co-Founder - Performance Matters

Dr. O'Malley introduced Mr. Dillaha and stated he made a presentation last week to the Director of Technology and other administrators. Mr. Dillaha's company can put the District's data into one place and is web based.

Mr. Dillaha gave his presentation in PowerPoint:

- Creates a web based integrated data base in which teachers can differentiate instruction.
- The company was founded in 2003.
- Consistent Color coding and data displays make figures easier to read.
- Evaluates proficiency and growth capacity
- Addresses the guiding questions of "How we are doing" as compared to the standard, ourselves and others
- Performed a hypothetic "quick day in the life of a teacher", a scenario in which teachers can track how students have performed in the past as compared to the present. Various data was reviewed from test scores to report card grades. The data can be compared many different ways.
- Maintain a partnership with RealTime.

There were several comments and questions from the Board:

- The program is capable of showing classroom data or other figures such as NWEA data. Information on how specific students performed could also be displayed and their scores were proficient, partially proficient or advanced proficient.
- The cost of the program is per student and based on how detailed the information provided is.
- Performance Matters is a compliment to RealTime. Specific student information, such as grades, goes through RealTime while other information comes from outside sources such as the County or State.
- Mr. Dillaha reviewed comparison clusters. This information can compare student achievement across the State or by more focused groups such as ethnicity.

- The program can track students all the way through their senior year of High School. It can also track the progress of a student if they are involved in a new program, like Everyday Math and indicate if there was any improvement
- Board members can have access to the system. Information may or may not be made available to parents. The Board can dictate what information a parent sees.
- The data obtained by Performance Matters is the property of the District. For example, if RealTime was no longer used by the District, the information they provided to Performance Matters could still be viewed.
- The information obtained is done through a scanner or would have to be graded as usual by the teacher and then handed over to Performance Matters in an Excel format.
- Some Districts that utilize Performance Matters are Perth Amboy, New Brunswick, Asbury Park and Princeton.
- The basic cost per pupil can range from \$7 to \$10 per student.
- Teacher and Principal profiles can also be maintained.
- The staff would not be ready to use a system so elaborate right away. The District would convert to it gradually.

 A tremendous amount of curriculum writing was done over the summer.

- Item #2 is participation for coaches and student athletes in a leadership workshop. The cost of which will be given at a later date.
- Item #3 is the acceptance of a \$4,000 award from the Italian American Committee which Mr. Farrell obtained.
 Some of the funds will cover costs at the Middle School such as textbooks and supplies.

- Reviewed the balanced scorecards. They are instruments that show the public how the District is measuring academic achievement. This is not information that is creating more work than it is worth. Dr. O'Malley stated the information is valuable.
- The District has 16 students attending Bayshore as compared to 21 last year. There are no new students attending Bayshore, the total actually declined by 5 students

X. COMMENTS & QUESTIONS FROM PUBLIC RELATING TO ADDITIONAL CONERNS:

Various Aberdeen and Matawan residents made comments, expressed concern, and/or raised questions regarding the following items included in the agenda to which Mr. Kenny responded.

There were no additional comments or questions from the public.

XI. OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Ruprecht would like to amend the current policy for nepotism to allow children of Board members to get hired for positions. Mr. Kenny stated the Superintendent can add that request to the agenda for the next meeting or it can be discussed under Old Business.

Ms. Rubino asked about the status of the District goals. Mr. Kenny stated it was going to be discussed tonight, however, Mr. O'Connell is not present. Ms. Rubino would like the goals put down on a sheet of paper.

Ms. Rubino asked what service J.W. Pepper provided. Dr. O'Malley stated the District purchases its sheet music from them.

XII. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Warren discussed what the goals should be for graduating seniors. He would like to see graduates attend institutions of higher learning for 4 years. Reviewed the statistics for the District's graduating seniors. If students obtain the goals listed, 95% of graduating students will obtain a degree from a 4-year program. These goals should be used as a metric to assess District performance. Students should have the basic ability to earn a 4-year degree.

Mr. Donaghue asked about the Carnegie units. A Carnegie unit is the equivalent to 120 hours of class study time or about a full year's education. Mr. Warren stated a Carnegie unit is about 120 hours of class study time or a full year's worth of education.

Dr. O'Malley asked how exclusive the number is, for example if there wasn't a social study component, the number may change.

Mr. Kenny stated a majority of these goals are curriculum based. He does not believe the Board should dictate curriculum, it should dictate goals. Mr. Kenny stated an example of a Board goal could be sending a certain amount of graduates to college while other students may go in a different direction. The Board would set the goals and he would support them depending on what they were.

Ms. Hayward stated the cost of the application may limit some students to only applying to three schools.

Dr. Delaney asked if what Mr. Warren is speaking about is a goal or a methodology. Mr. Warren stated it's a methodology. As a District, Mr. Warren wants our students to be accepted to better universities. Mr. Delaney stated there are niches, such as students who are auto mechanics, that won't go to a 4-year college.

Mr. Delaney stated the District may be adopting what is already necessary to graduate.

Ms. Rubino stated success is not based upon going to a 4 year school.

A discussion took place among Board members regarding goals.

Dr. Gambino asked for the results of the accuplacer for District graduates who are attending Brookdale.
