VII. BOARD PRESIDENT’S REPORT

Ms. Demarest gave a warm welcome to the Public.

VIII. SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT

Dr. O’Malley thanked the maintenance and custodial staff for all their efforts in setting up for the evening. He turned the meeting over to Ms. Olsen to discuss some of the highlights of the Middle School.

The Middle School had a great to the school year in September. During Breast Cancer Awareness Week the student counsel raised \$1,000.00. Great efforts were made for voter registration by for the student counsel. A thank you went to Mr. Miller for the 7th graders honoring the veterans. Ms. Olsen thanked the PTOS and the Education Foundation for all their support.

Ms. Olsen thanked the Education Foundation and Ms.Devito, the 7th grade Science teacher for working with the nine students who entered the Six Flags 7th grade Science contest and won 1st place. Certificates were handed out at such time.

A presentation of the 2007-2008 standardized test scores was made by Ms. Zitarosa, Mr. Farrell, and Ms. DeLuca.

Ms. Zitarosa spoke about the NJASK 3, 4 and 5 elementary grades. She gave an overview of the Language Arts Literacy, the Mathematics and Science assessments.

Ms. Zitarosa spoke about the NJASK Score Reporting and highlighted where the District is in comparison to the DFG and the STATE. She also discussed the Cluster Mean Scores and where the areas of strength are and the areas of concern.

Ms. Zitarosa gave an overview of the NJASK 5 assessment of skills and knowledge. She spoke about the NJDOE explanation for raising the benchmark proficiencies.

Ms. Zitarosa spoke about the Action Plan to achieve improvement with the test scores.

Mr. Farrell reviewed the standardized test scores for the Middle School. He discussed the NJASK 6th, 7th grade assessment for Language Arts and Math proficiencies versus the State/DFG.

Mr. Farrell reviewed the NJASK 8th grade Language Arts, Math, and Science proficiencies versus the State/DFG. He summarized the results and explained the areas that need to be addressed and the Action Plan.

Ms. DeLuca discussed the Advanced Placement Tests, HSPA, SAT Scores and the NJ Pass tests which were taken at the High School. She reviewed the comparison from 2007 to 2008 of the AP scores. Of the 106 students that took 248 AP exams, 71% scored 3 or higher.

Ms. DeLuca reviewed the HSPA test results.

Ms. DeLuca discussed the SAT which is a standardized test for college admissions and the NJPASS.

Ms. DeLuca reviewed the Corrective Action Plan and where the District would like to move forward.

At such time Ms. Demarest took comments and questions from the Board.

Due to the changes with the standardized test was the DFG adjusted to reflect such?
Ms. Zitarosa commented that it was.

There were phones calls and follow ups to remind parents and students to prepare for these tests.

There was progress in the 06-07 school year. The prior Administration deserves some credit and to support the new Administration going forward.

When would the sub group data be available? Dr. O'Malley is working to gather that information.

There was a concern that there was more testing and how it was effecting the instructional time. Approximately one to three hours more of testing and it was not effecting instructional time.

IX. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

Mathew Bratsch, the student representative made several comments.

- Discussed the results of the first debate tournament whereby Christopher Harris placed 2nd in Humorous Interpretation and Melissa Linden placed 5th in Improvisational Speaking and a 6th place finish in Poetry Reading. The team placed 5th out of 25 teams.
- The new benches at the High School to be used by the seniors.

COMMENTS & QUESTIONS FROM PUBLIC RELATING TO BOARD AGENDA ITEMS

Various Aberdeen and Matawan residents made comments, expressed concern, and/or raised questions regarding the following items included in the agenda.

Ms. Kelly School Psychologist,

- Has been with the District for 31 years. She spoke about the abolishment of the Supervisor of Special Education position and the creation of the Director position. She spoke about Ms. Rappaport and the fact that she has been with the District for 30 years. She was a School Psychologist for 7 years and a Supervisor and Director of Special Services for 23 years. I feel privileged to have worked under her. Ms. Rappaport would no longer be the head of this department. Ms. Rappaport is bright, does not back down from difficult issues, is knowledgeable at the Federal and State level, and is a go to person. You will not find her equal.

Mr. David Nash,

- Ms. Rappaport's attorney spoke about Ms. Rappaport's 23 prior evaluations and how they were glowing. Recently, Mr. Glastein reviewed Ms. Rappaport and described her as an exceptional leader and handles her department effectively and she helped him when he was interim Superintendent and it was a pleasure working with her. He requested the Board to review the recommendation made by Dr. O'Malley.

Mr. Campbell

- An attorney who represents two other employees spoke. He stated the functions of the Special Education position would be the same whether it is called a Supervisor or Director. He discussed the motivation behind the change. He requested the Board to review the recommendation made by Dr. O'Malley.

Ms. Mattern,

- A teacher at Matawan/Aberdeen Regional School District spoke. She is here as a taxpayer and concurs with the statements made by Ms. Kelly. Mr. Gross stated that the salary of the Psychologist position would be determined by the Board, the MRPA and the salary guides.

Ms. Hayward Aberdeen NJ,

- Spoke as a parent. She spoke about her son and his difficulties with reading. The goal here is to fix something that is broken and the children will benefit from this.

Ms. Napey Aberdeen NJ,

- Is a special education educator. She feels something is not working and the system is broken. Parents have not been able to speak. Requested the Board to make a decision to advocate for children.

Mr. Bratsch,

- A student who is classified at Matawan/Aberdeen Regional High School district spoke about the positive experience he has had with the Child Study team. He thanked the Child Study team for his success and stated that there was nothing broken.

Mr. & Mrs. Casagrande, Aberdeen NJ,

- Discussed their son's learning disability. Their son had great teachers and were given good advice but teachers were fearful to help parents.
- Interested in the results of the sub groups as well.

Mr. Werner, Aberdeen NJ,

- Spoke about the system being broken.
- Thanked the Directors of Accountability for their presentation.
- Trusts that Dr. O'Malley has put the Community and the children first and will not tolerate any one who speaks otherwise. Dr. O'Malley is putting his team together and will be held accountable.
