6. **Resolution authorizing adoption of the Final 403(B) Regulations**

- Ms. Irons discussed the 403B Plan that will go into effect in January 2009, including the software to be utilized to track who is enrolled in the plan and their contributions. The provides an audit trail. The software will monitor the activity of district employees.

To approve the adoption of the Final 403(B) regulations (The Plan) to comply with the requirements of certain provisions of the Internal Revenue Code 1986, as amended (the Code) and the final Treasury Regulations promulgated under Sections 403(B). The Plan document shall be effective January 1, 2009, and is hereby approved and that the Administrator of the Plan is directed to execute the Plan document.

To approve the implementation of a centralized database to monitor compliance with the final regulations. This database software by Retirement Manager Compliance Plus is developed by AIG Retirement Services Company. There is no cost to the district for this service.

7. **To approve the agreement with Game Time Advertising, LLC.**

A discussion took place regarding the contract with Gametime Advertising:

- Dr. O'Malley negotiated with the company and came up with new items.
- Instead of a 10 year contract the contract will be for 3 years.
- Gametime will own the scoreboard for the 3 years and will be responsible for any repairs necessary.
- The district's revenue share is now 30% instead of 40% as in the original contract.
- Want to verify that language in the contract does not hold the district responsible to vendors who have purchased advertising space if the scoreboard is not used or is broken
- Sponsors being considered and if the district has the right to object to any of them.

- Mr. Gross stated the main concern for the district should be to have the exclusivity sponsor clause of the contract changed. If the district decides not to renew with Gametime after 3 years, the district can not solicit sponsors for a period of 2 years. This is a concern because then school related clubs or teams can not solicit these vendors for fundraising purposes. If the district does renew it can continue to solicit additional funds from the vendors for fundraising purposes. The Board of Education will continue this discussion during executive session.

Ms. Esposito, Matawan,

- Item #3, page 3 of 8 under the Personnel Agenda. The teachers are receiving \$20.00 per hour for what? Teachers discuss students during prep time. However, since many teachers do not have a common prep time, they will need to discuss student related issues before or after school hours.

Mr. Warren, 7 Ithaca Court, Aberdeen,

- Congratulated Ms. Irons and Dr. O'Malley on the audit.
- Commended the Naviance program on its success.
- The new nepotism policy does not include any exceptions for work study students. District bylaws that exceed State mandates.
- Another teacher received an advanced degree from Walden University. Believes this makes 10 out of 13 teachers who have received degrees from this University. Does board have a plan to encourage intellectual diversity? Teachers should be receiving different training. The Board of Education can not control where teachers receive their education.
- The foundation for the affirmative action program because there is isn't any educational diversity. Walden University is not accredited professionally. St. Elizabeth College offers teachers after-school programs.
- Student agenda for the high school makes two statements. First to advance from one grade to another a student must gain 30 credits but to participate in extra-curricular programs 27 ½ credits are needed. If a student does not earn the 30 credits they will not participate in extra-curricular programs.

- Is there a set formula for a student ranking within their class? This formula is in the course outline which can be found in the guidance department.
- All homework assignments are looked over by teachers to see if answered correctly. What is the actual requirement of teachers to review homework? Homework is part of the student's grade.

Mr. Delaney, 804 Harbor Place,

- Conducted an investigation into the Baysshore Jointure controversy. Dr. O'Malley is correct with respect to his position while the other side is wrong. One or two people could be the culprit's behinds scaring parents and will share that information with the Board of Education once it's known.
- Salary of the Superintendent of the Baysshore Jointure Commission. The Superintendent is not paid. Instead the district received \$6,000 from the Jointure in May of 2006. Nothing was received during 2007.

Ms. Westin, Aberdeen,

- Status of the leasing with the Baysshore Jointure Commission at this time. The lease is being worked on and something should be received from the Jointure by the end of the week. The possibly exists that Dr. O'Malley may have a lease for the Board of Education to vote on for the November 17, 2008 Action Meeting.

- Ms. Demarest did not want the public to be under the impression that the Board of Education has a definite policy regarding teacher review of student homework.

XIII. NEW BUSINESS
